Thanks to the generosity of many ALHS alumni and friends, the ALHS Alumni Foundation, a *Dollars for Scholars* Chapter, awards a wide variety of scholarships to deserving Lincoln Seniors each year. In 2020, the Foundation awarded \$89,700 in scholarships. We are pleased to announce two new scholarships for 2021:

The Marilyn "Lynn" Fisher Memorial Scholarship and the Ralph and Marilyn Satre Wilson Memorial Scholarship.

The following scholarships are available through the ALHS Alumni Foundation Dollars for Scholars Chapter in 2021:

ALHS Alumni Association Scholarship

The Alumni Association offers annual scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each. Our Scholarship Committee awards these scholarships based on the GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. The number of scholarships awarded varies yearly based on the interest earned on the Foundation Endowment. We will award 14 Association scholarships in 2021.

ALHS Class of 1963 Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of their 1963 classmates in 2018, and increased in 2019, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually. The scholarship will be awarded based on GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants.

BLH Bevington Scholarship

Build Lincoln Higher Club (BLH Club) established an endowed scholarship in memory of Erna Bevington, a former language arts teacher and department head at Lincoln. The amount of the scholarship is \$1,000. The number of scholarships awarded varies yearly based on the interest earned on the endowment. Applicants must be related to a current member of the BLH Club who joined by January 31st of the applicant's year of graduation, have a minimum GPA of 2.5, and have been accepted to a post-secondary institution.

Brody Middle School PTO Scholarship

Established by the Brody PTO board (2019 - 2020), a \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who

attended Brody Middle School for 6th - 8th grade, demonstrates community service, and has a GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Carole Jones Memorial Nursing Scholarship

Established by Todd Kincheloe '79, Alan Kincheloe '80, Janette Kincheloe Brenner '82, and Mark Kincheloe, to honor the memory of their mother and her lifetime of service as a nurse in recovery rooms and nephrology clinics, a \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2019 to a student who plans to major in nursing. A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required.

Class of 1964 Memorial Scholarship

The Class of 1964 Memorial Scholarship was established in 2019 by members of the ALHS Class of 1964 in memory of their former classmates. A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who demonstrates solid academic performance, community service, leadership and financial need. Acceptance at an accredited institution and a minimum GPA of 2.5 are required.

Class of 1979 Scholarship

Established by the Class of 1979, at its 40th Class reunion, one \$500 scholarship will be awarded in 2020. The scholarship will be awarded based on GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants.

The Clayle, Milva, Maxhn, and Janine McCaw Scholarship Fund

Established in 2012 by Dr. John '35 McCaw and his wife Maxine in honor of their children, all of whom graduated

from ALHS, four (4) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded annually to students who demonstrate a solid academic performance, community service and financial need. Acceptance at an accredited institution and a minimum GPA of 3.0 are required.

Coralie Cherry Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of Coralie Cherry '47, by her family and friends, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a student who attended either Morris Elementary (formerly Mann-Watrous) or McCombs Middle School, is actively involved in Lincoln activities, and who demonstrates service to the south Des Moines community. Coralie was a lifetime South Sider, a true supporter of Lincoln and south Des Moines. She worked in the Lincoln feeder schools, was very active in the Alumni Foundation and worked hard to keep the history of Fort Des Moines alive.

Dan Smoot Memorial Scholarship

Established by Jeni Weldon Van Wyk '91 in memory of her friend Dan Smoot '90, one \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2016 to a student who is accepted to a trade school program. Preference will be given to applicants who participated in band or choir at Lincoln.

The Dave Mills Scholarship

Dave Mills '50, dedicated his retirement years to community service. To honor Dave's work, one \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who has shown leadership, commitment

and passion for volunteer service to improve the community. The student should be recognized by established service organizations for demonstrating strong organizational, leadership and communications skills to accomplish stated goals and benefit others through volunteer efforts.

The Dave Ostrem Family Scholarship

Established in 2015 by Dave Ostrem '49, up to five (5) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to students who plan to declare a major course of study in math or science. The GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants will also be considered. Preference will be given to students who plan to attend college in Iowa.

Dr. John W. Green, Jr. Family Scholarship

Established in 2012 by the late Virginia Green in honor of her family, two (2) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to students who demonstrate financial need and solid academic performance. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

Dr. Patricia K. Tice Scholarship

Established in honor of Dr. Tice, long time ALHS award-winning Senior Guidance Counselor & Scholarship Chair who retired in 2013, one \$1,000.00 scholarship will be awarded to an ALHS senior who has a strong academic record, high morals, demonstrates financial need, and has been accepted to attend Iowa State University in the fall.

Under Dr. Tice's leadership, the ALHS College Bound Rails Wall was created. Dr. Tice's advocacy and tireless efforts for students resulted in ALHS students earning more than \$30M in scholarships, including a DMPS record of \$8.2M for the Class of 2010. Dr. Tice encouraged and motivated Lincoln students to be the best they can be, no matter what their field of endeavor might be.

The Erickson Family Foundation Scholarship

Established in 2015 by Miriam Erickson Brown '80 and Warren Erickson '86, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2016 to a student seeking advanced education in the field of business. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. The financial need of the applicants will also be considered.

Fuse DSM, Your Chamber of Commerce Scholarship

Established by the Des Moines East and South Chamber of Commerce, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2014 to a student who has worked or volunteered on the south side of Des Moines. The GPA and financial need of the student will also be considered.

George "Skip" Timmons Memorial Scholarship

Skip '53 was a lifelong advocate of Lincoln High School and "Southside Pride." He established the ALHS Alumni Foundation in 1991 with Bill Backstrom '48 and Marge White '39; and served as President of the Alumni Association from 2001 - 2003. They created the endowment fund that provides scholarships to Lincoln graduates to this day.

Established in 2019 by Marlene Timmons and family, two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to students who plan to major in nursing. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

The Gloria Gray Scholarship

Established in 2015 by ALHS Alumni Foundation Past President Gloria Gray '66, two scholarships up to \$1,000 each will be awarded beginning in 2015, to students who plan to attend a DMACC Workforce Training Academic Vocational Training Program. The career areas include: Business/ Information Technology, Health Care, and Manufacturing/Industrial Technology. The scholarship may be used for tuition, books and/or supplies. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. The financial need of the applicants will also be considered.

The Hews Family Scholarship

Established by Steve Hews '88 in 2020, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student with financial need. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. Preference will be given to students who are accepted to trade school programs.

Howard Wayne Foust Memorial Scholarship

Established by Brenda Foust Mahannah '57 and Stephen Mahannah '57 in memory of Brenda's father, Howard Foust '37, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2018 to a student who excelled at sports at Lincoln. The financial need of the applicants will also be considered. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

Hugh Kent Memorial Science Scholarship

Established in 2011 in memory of Hugh Kent, a former Biology teacher at Lincoln, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who demonstrates a passion to learn about science and intends to major in science at the college or university of his/her choice. A minimum GPA of 2.0, a statement of interest in science, and a written recommendation from a teacher who has observed the student's growth and interest in science are required.

The Jerry Crawford Family Scholarship

Established by Jerry '67 and Linda Crawford in honor of their children Katelyn '02, Erin '05 and Conor '08, one \$2,500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who attends Macalaster College. The GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants will also be considered.

Jim & Ralph Wilson Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2009 by alumni Jim '45 and Ralph '48 Wilson, one \$1,000 scholarship is awarded annually based on the GPA and financial need of the applicants. The scholarship was changed to a memorial scholarship in 2018.

John and Maxine McCaw Memorial Scholarship

Established by the late John McCaw '35 and his wife Maxine, one (1) two-year scholarship of \$1,000 per year will be awarded every two years, beginning in 2021, to a student who demonstrates a solid academic performance, community service and financial need. Acceptance to an accredited post-secondary institution and a minimum GPA of 3.0 are required.

Leo Bridal Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of Leo Bridal '41, by Mary Vaught, a lifetime friend, in accordance with Leo's wishes, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually starting in 2016. The GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants will be considered.

Marilyn "Lynn" Fisher Memorial Scholarship

Established in Memory of Marilyn "Lynn" Fisher '53, by her family, one \$600 scholarship will be awarded in 2021. Lynn graduated valedictorian in her class and felt strongly about the value of educational achievement. The applicant must be a student who demonstrated leadership and service to the south Des Moines community. Financial need and a minimum 2.5 GPA are required.

The Meline Family Swimming Scholarship

Established by Matt Meline '86, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a qualified participant of the boys or girls Lincoln High swim team that has demonstrated leadership, team support and consistent participation on the team. A letter of recommendation from the swim team coach is required. The financial need, academic performance and extracurricular activities of the applicants will also be considered. The intention to swim during one's post-secondary education is not required.

The Myrna Newbury Agan Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2017 in memory of Myrna Newbury Agan, Class of January, 1955, by her children; Earl Agan, Jr. '76, Thomas S. Agan '80, and Barbara Agan Timmins, '86; one \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to students who plan to pursue a degree in Education. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

Nicholas J. Mancuso Scholarship

Established in 2012 by Nicholas Mancuso '48, and increased in 2019, one \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who intends to declare a major course of study in business. The financial need and community service of the applicants will also be considered.

Ralph and Marilyn Satre Wilson Memorial Scholarship

Established by Tim Wilson, in memory of his parents, Ralph and Marilyn Satre Wilson '48, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2021 to a student who plans to major in Administrative Services. Financial need, community service and a minimum 2.5 GPA are also required.

Ray "Monk" and Erma Wilson Family Scholarship

Established to honor the parents of Jim '45, Vivian '44, Ralph '48, and Ray '46, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2018. The scholarship will be awarded based on GPA and financial need of the applicants.

Raymond and Shirley Phillips Memorial Scholarship

Established by Raymond "Skip" Phillips '68, Pam Phillips Brennan '66, Shirley Phillips Kunkle '68, Kirk Phillips '71 and Candy Phillips Conlan '65, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a student who plans to pursue a major course of study in music. The GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants will also be considered.

Richard Hurd Scholarship

Established in 2019 by Richard Hurd '70, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who intends to major in business. The career goals, financial need and community service of the applicants will also be considered.

Rolland Geil & Ruth Johnson Nichols Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2009 by Ruth Johnson Nichols '42, one \$1,000 scholarship has been awarded annually to benefit a student who demonstrates great financial need. Ruth's family is continuing this scholarship as \$2,000 in memory of both Ruth and their father, Rolland Geil '40.

Sarg Fontanini Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2012 by the Fontanini family to honor the memory of Sarg Fontanini '33, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who demonstrates exceptional character, solid

academic performance and financial need. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

South Des Moines Sculpture Park Scholarship

Established by Phil Barber '68 and Chuck Mettler '61, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a student seeking advanced education in the field of art. Applicants must submit a letter outlining why the student is pursuing a career in art and two examples of his/her artwork (drawing, painting or sculpture) to the Lincoln High School art department. The South Des Moines Sculpture Park Board of Directors will judge the submissions.

Studebaker Elementary School Scholarship

One scholarship of at least \$500 is awarded annually to a student who attended Studebaker Elementary for at least three years. The GPA and financial need of the applicants is also considered.

William "Bill" McKibben Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2011 in memory of Bill McKibben '53, by his wife Shirley McKibben, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded based on the GPA, community service and financial need of the applicants.

Wolfe Family Scholarship

Established in 2012, and increased in 2019, one \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded annually based on the GPA, community service and financial need of the applicants. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

Zac Bales-Henry Scholarship

Established in 2016 by Zac Bales-Henry '05, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student with a documented learning disability who plans to pursue post-secondary education. A letter of recommendation from a teacher or staff member who has observed the student's efforts to overcome challenges is required.

Greeting Railsplitter Friends,

I hope this note finds you well! As you probably know, Lincoln has looked much different than prior years due to the pandemic. On February 15 we had the opportunity to welcome back all of our students five days per week. Families had an opportunity to choose to keep their students online full time or return to in person

the rest of the year. So, when I say we welcomed back all of our students, I mean 1,400 of them.

This year has been a struggle to be honest. Our teachers have learned how to be online teachers and in-person teachers simultaneously, our students have had to learn how to manage their time, prioritize, and self-motivate when at home learning. Honestly, both of these groups of people have strived and struggled to various degrees. Needless to say we are looking forward to the day when 2,400+ students are back at Lincoln High School!

Finally, I am excited to share we are offering six new social studies classes next year which are designed to be relevant and relatable

to our students. Titles of these classes (all electives and not required) are: Global Black History, African American Studies, Indigenous Peoples' History of the US, Chicanola Studies, Asian American & Pacific Islander History, LatinX History, LGBTQ+ History, and Intersectional Feminism. We are also adding a course titled Youth CVoice for Equity where students learn (and unlearn) ideas for examining the social world including theories about oppressions, justice, and equity. The learning is grounded in culturally relevant pedagogy that supports students in academic achievement through centering their social identities and experiences.

I hope everyone stays safe. I am looking forward to seeing you when we have an opportunity to connect in the near future!

received many honors including the Order of the Coif Honor Society, and Member and Associate Editor, Iowa Law Review.

Chris's work history has been a series of steppingstones that began during his college years, as Trial Clerk at the Iowa District Court in and for Polk County while at Grand View, and as a University of Iowa College of Law Research Assistant.

After college, he entered private practice as an associate at Faegre & Benson, a full-service national and international law firm. He focused on complex litigation, general commercial litigation, internal investigation regarding regulatory inquiries including the Securities and Exchange Commission and different State Attorneys General, securities litigation and securities arbitration, employment litigation, and employment counseling.

He went on to be a member at Belin McCormick, a premier full-service law firm, where he focused on general commercial litigation, internal investigation, asset identification and recovery in cases of employee malfeasance, employment and civil rights litigation, and employment counseling and advice.

Chris then became Senior Litigation Counsel for Aviva USA Corporation (now Athene), the United States subsidiary of the world's fifth largest insurance carrier by premium. His work there included class/mass action litigation, multi-district litigation, complex civil litigation in federal and state courts and administrative agencies, and internal investigations. He also advised and represented the company on issues including employment law, employee benefits, and contract.

In his next move, Chris became a Judge of the District Court, Fifth Judicial District of Iowa, where he presided over and adjudicated civil, criminal, and family law matters, and administrative appeals.

He then became a Judge for the Iowa Court of Appeals, where he handled adjudication and disposition of appeals of all types, and authored over 800 opinions.

In his most recent step, Chris became a Justice on the Supreme Court of Iowa, where his responsibilities include the adjudication and disposition of appeals of all types, as well as administrative responsibilities related to the work of the Iowa Judicial Branch of the Supreme Court.

To his credit are many presentations and publications regarding topics including the Constitution, errors in criminal proceedings, social media rules for judicial branch attorneys, law of mass communications, and employment law issues. Chris has received many professional awards, and is a member of the American Bar Association. He has also been a board member for Polk County Bar Association's Volunteer Lawyers Project, the Iowa Judge's Association, the Iowa Asian Alliance, and BRAVO of Greater Des Moines.

Due to Covid 19 restrictions, we were unable to recognize the 2020 Alumni Hall of Fame inductees at our usual dinner celebration last year. We would like to recognize them here, and remind you that their full biographies are located on our alumni website.

Clarence "Laddie" Jobe joined the Navy after high school, and then went on to a 33-year career with the Des Moines Police Department, retiring as a Lieutenant in the Narcotics and Vice Department. During his years with DMPD, he graduated from the FBI academy, and worked in

Homicide in solving some of the most high profile cases of his time. He spoke to community groups about how to be safe and educated parent groups about drugs. In retirement he is on several police boards and committees.



Judy Lewis graduated from University of Iowa with a BS in in Sociology and with Honors and High Distinction, and was Class President. She graduated from Yale with a master's degree in Sociology. She then began her life's work in Community Medicine and Pediatrics at the University

of Connecticut School of Medicine, where she is now Emeritus Professor. She has worked in more than 50 countries conducting research, training, and evaluation. She helped develop the Global Health Program at the medical school and directed it for 10 years.

ALUMNI NOTES BY ANNA WILLIAMS '63



See if this "Wistful Breeze" recollection from **Jeffrey Barber** '63 brings back some memories for you: "The other evening, I was relaxing in my library reading and sipping a cup of tea. As I looked down at my cup my eyes shifted unexpectedly, I became aware of the coffee table I had just set my cup on. Suddenly, and for no particular reason the thought entered my mind, sitting there at 76 years old, that I had built that coffee table with my own hands over 60 years ago at Lincoln High School. In those days we were offered vocation classes, like metal shop, woodworking, and auto mechanics. Skill sets the youth of today don't seem to require.

The consciousness of this memory stopped me in my usual common thought stream. I closed my book and it was as if I was mystically ushered through time, into the past. My mind took me back to the Lincoln High School woodshop, where I had built the table. There, I was sitting on my bench looking out the huge shop windows at the sunny day. I could hear the table saws. The fresh aroma of new wood being cut filled my senses, as if I was actually back in that woodshop. I felt the youthful excitement of producing such an enjoyable project, that I could present to my Mother for her Christmas. That is what I built the table for, my Mom.



I commenced to thinking about my youthful days at Lincoln High, my friends, the shops, the old gym, before the new Round House, the ancient wooden lockers, the spacious auditorium. My wood shop teacher, **Mr.**Jed Miller, came into my thoughts. He, of course, looked the same as he did in 1961! It was good to see him. I remember if one of us made a mistake and tried to cover for it, he would say, "No matter how thin you slice it, it's still baloney." I looked around

the shop at all the activity with my fifteen year old eyes once again, I was absorbed in the memory and was truly fifteen for that very brief moment in time. It's wonderful what memories are lingering in the chambers of our minds.

My memories of Lincoln High school flashed before me in those wonderful extraordinary moments. The disappointment was they left me just as swiftly as they came. I unconsciously reached for my tea, took a sip. I leaned back in comfort, I reluctantly grasped that I was back in the realm today. I remember thinking what a precious reminiscence, all in what seemed like an instantaneous flash, then just as swiftly disappearing -- like a vapor in a "Wistful Breeze." Thanks so much, Jeff! I have a plant sitting on the ashtray stand my brother, **Charlie**, made in 1958.

Events like our Auction last fall often remind us of how many families have generations of students at Lincoln! When our ALHS Scholarship recipient **Emily Brownell Theis**'98 came to pick up her auction purchases, she mentioned that her great grandmother and a lot of her relatives graduated from Lincoln. We asked Emily if she'd write this up for our Alumni Notes, and here is what she shared:






