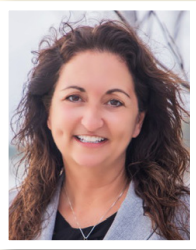

Here’s a bit of interesting history. Abraham Lincoln High School is typically simplified to just Lincoln High School or Lincoln. It was constructed to address the increasing enrollment of students at nearby East High School. By 1923, construction was completed, at a cost of \$949,754.95. The school originally had 55 classrooms, a swimming pool, two gymnasiums, several labs, an art and music room, a cafeteria, and an auditorium, providing for a total student capacity of 1,300. There are a number of valuable items preserved by the school. The front floor is monogramed in bronze and marble. There are two famous portraits — The Boy Lincoln, painted by Russell Cowles along with The Statesman, painted by William Reaser. And in the main corridor is the famous bronze bust of Lincoln. But did you know it’s the work of **Laurence Stewart, an East High School graduate?** All the fun things we learn from Google!

We look forward to celebrating with you again in 2023! ■

Greetings ALHS Alumni,

I hope this message finds you doing well. As I write this message, we are four weeks into the new school year. We have had a great start to the year; perhaps the best start in my 12 years as the principal of Lincoln High School! Students are working hard and our staff is providing relevant and rigorous lessons daily. Currently our enrollment sits between 2300-2400 students which is a slight increase over previous years. I am frequently asked what our demographic make-up is at Lincoln High School now: 38% Hispanic, 35% White, 13% Black, and 7% Asian. Currently 18% of our students are ELL students (24 different languages) and 16% are part of our Special Education Program.

Technically, this year begins our centennial celebration. However, after talking with a number of alumni and staff, we want to celebrate this special event the entire calendar year

starting in January 2023. We are very close to announcing a capital campaign in the coming weeks that we will couple with the centennial celebrations. Our major event for the upcoming celebration will be held the Saturday of Homecoming Week, 2023. We expect this to be in the month of September, but can’t confirm until later this school year. The very early planning has the special celebration kicking off with a homecoming parade, followed by family events at the school for a few hours, then wrapping up the evening with a more formal dinner event for adults. Again, this is very early in the planning stages. We will soon be reaching out to our alumni to see if there are individuals who would like to be on the formal planning committee. The best way to receive updates is to follow us on facebook at Abraham Lincoln High School Railsplitters. We will also update our website as well.

I hope everyone has a wonderful fall. ■

DAVE MILLS '50



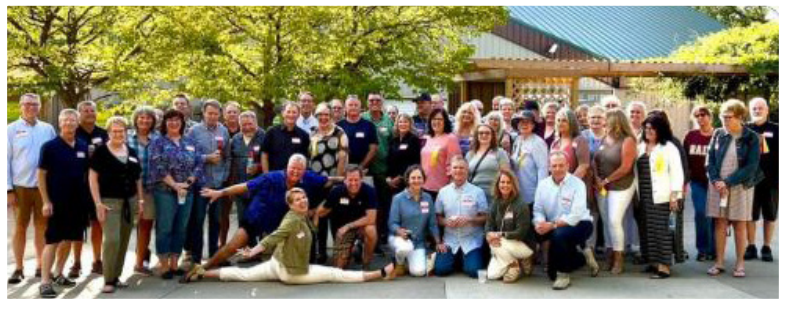
Dave Mills '50 started celebrating his 90th Birthday (June 24) in mid-May in a unique style. Since all the family couldn't get together, he decided to take the celebration to each family member. This included sporting and community events, museums, theater, tourist attractions, picnics and dining at unusual restaurants. He began a 22-day trip to Colorado and Arizona (four cities and 11 persons), returning to Iowa in early June to celebrate with 20 family members and many friends from his Wednesday Coffee Group and volunteer activities.

Dave's family covers 97 years of ALHS legacy. His grandmother, **Lena Overholser**, was a cook in the school lunch room shortly after it opened and his mother, **Dorothy Overholser Mills '30**, two aunts — **Maxine Overholser Swesey '38** and **Alberta Brandow** — and an uncle, **Donald Overholser '36**, were all graduates. His late wife, **Marge Wolver Mills '52**, sister **Shirley Coggins '54**, and brother **Jim Mills '68**, along with his four children, **Trudy Hastie '72**, **Linda Mills '74**, **David Mills '76** and **Margie Moriarty '78**, also graduated from Lincoln. Four of his five grandchildren, **John Weil '97**, **Ed '02** and **Bryan '04 Moriarty** and **Megan Hastie '07** were ALHS grads.

In 2006 Dave was inducted into the ALHS Alumni Hall of Fame.

Dave retired in 1994 after 20 years with the Iowa Department of Education, Vocational Rehabilitation Division and eight years as Executive Director of the National Rehabilitation Association in Washington DC. After retirement, he volunteered with PPH Book Sales for 35 years and AARP National and Iowa AARP for 25 years. He has served as a Relays Official for the Drake Relays for 66 years, and on the Drake Relays Committee since 1971. In April, 2022 Dave was awarded the Paul Morrison Drake Relays Legacy Award, becoming the fifth recipient of the award.

And now you know why the **Dave Mills Scholarship**, with emphasis on volunteerism, was established in 2012! Dave is looking forward to volunteering with ALHS Alumni in planning and participating in the 100th Lincoln High School Anniversary. ■




