Hello and Happy New Year!

I hope everyone's 2020 has been off to a good start. My favorite groundhog said that Spring is right around the corner. I sure hope he's right.

I'll start with an update on year-end 2019. Unfortunately, we did not make our Pledge to Mission. The Smoky Mountain District Pledge was set at \$69,300, and we gave \$47,972. Nevertheless, \$47 thousand *plus* is a tremendous amount to have sent in, and I am extremely proud of all our local units who gave so generously last year.

For 2020, the Holston Conference has once again set the Smoky Mountain UMW District Pledge at \$69,300. Whether we get to that lofty goal this year or not, I know that we will do the best we can. I <u>can</u> tell you we got off to a great start at our District New Visions event, held at Ebenezer on February 8th. Our offering was \$443, and the ladies at Ebenezer generously donated the refreshments following the event, so that every penny of the registration money was able to go to the District's Pledge to Mission, for a total of \$628 – a wonderful amount of money to have collected at a single event! (Perhaps we can try to beat that at our Day Apart event on March 21st!)

Many of you have picked up Gift to Mission/Gift in Memory cards at our events. I have ordered a fresh

assortment of cards from Mission Resources, and they should arrive in time for Day Apart. So, be sure to check those out and replenish your supply. As a reminder, they are free to take, and you give \$5.00 to your Unit Treasurer as you use them. Your Unit Treasurer sends in that money with your quarterly remittance. Sending these cards is a simple way to add funds towards our Pledge.

The Charter for Racial Justice is being brought back to the forefront of our minds in various ways this year. A CD is being made for each local unit to have and share as a possible program for your unit. Each unit is encouraged to have a copy of the Charter for your UMW members. Susan will be ordering them, and they will be available at the Presi-dent/Treasurers Training. Units are encouraged to read books on Racism and discuss, as well as possi-bly organizing a worship service on racial justice. Most importantly, the Mission Today form is being revised this year to include more emphasis on the Charter for Racial Justice. Units will have to meet 3 out of 8 of the requirements this year. Also, on the UMW website, there is a download "Tools for Re-sources" that might be used to help meet the require-ment. The proceeds are distributed via the UMW District, Conference, and national connections and also to many local projects that help women, children and youth.

In 2019, we met our unit's Pledge to Missions and donated to Wesley House, Henderson Settlement, Red Bird Mission, Brighter Future for Children & Youth, Susannah's House, UMCOR, the Kids First Child Advocacy Center, The Crisis Center for Women—IVAS, Phillips Lifeline (Emergency Alert System), the Trinity Mattress Ministry, the Boys & Girls Club of Loudon County, the Good Samaritan Center of Loudon Co., and the Panther Pack Weekend Food Program at Lenoir City Elementary.

The church is located at 300 W 2nd Avenue, Lenoir City, TN 37771, and the sale entrance to the Fellowship Hall is on the C Street side of the church. Sale hours are 9:00 AM – 5:00 on Friday and 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM Saturday.

This event is a gigantic "sale" that features children's clothing and toys, home goods, craft supplies, holiday decorations, shoes, handbags, jewelry, clothing for adults and children, and all kinds of dishes, pots, pans, luggage, and miscellaneous items. All items are donated by church members and friends, and the entire church, not just UMW members, helps with the week-long setup and cleanup on Saturday afternoon.

Our prices are very competitive, and many in our local community are served. Items remaining at the end of the sale are donated to veterans' organizations, United Methodist mission projects and local thrift stores. EACH item goes to a deserving home.


There is a bake sale with delicious items prepared by church members.
