Spiritual Growth Devotional Summer to Autumn 2021 – Love One Another

Dear UMW Sisters,

To find inspiration in writing this I only had to look outside and view God's creation. Beyond the windows and doors, where I don't venture enough, are the summer colors and floral scents that abound! Very soon it will be beautiful harvest colors and fall planting time. Those things are easy to love but often, in contrast, we struggle with loving certain circumstances and those around us.

I am reminded of a devotional by Patricia Raybon about the tulip bulbs she begrudgingly received from her daughter who had brought them all the way home to the U.S. after a visit to Amsterdam one early summer. She put on quite a show of excitement so her daughter never knew tulips were her least favorite flower, since they bloom early and fade fast. She also begrudged the July weather being too hot to plant them. By September she planted what she called "my daughter's bulbs" with love. With each turn of the rocky soil, her concern for the bulbs grew. Giving their plant bed a final pat, she offered the bulbs a blessing "sleep well" hoping to see blooming tulips in the spring. Pat said, "My little project became a humble reminder of God's call for us to love one another, even if we're not each other's "favorites." Looking past each other's faulty "weeds" we're enabled by God to extend love to others, even in temperamental seasons. Over time mutual love blooms in spite of ourselves." "By this" Jesus said, "everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:35). One weekend Patricia's daughter arrived for a visit just as the tulips showed themselves. 
