RCHJA 2024 Rules and Regulations

- 1. All trainers, exhibitors, and guardians must be familiar with and are responsible for adhering to the Rules and Regulations set for RCHJA.
- 2. RCHJA presents its shows under the guidance of USEF's rules and regulations. Where those rules and regulations do not apply, the decision of RCHJA management is binding.
- Any act of discourtesy to any judge, official, management, owner, exhibitor, trainer or staff member will be grounds for removal without refund and may bar said individual from participating in future RCHJA events.
- 4. Stalls are held either by entry with credit card on file or by prepayment, refundable if cancelled on or before the entry deadline (one week prior to show). Stall counts can be texted to Alexis Gamel at 904-993-2053 or emailed to Entries@rchja.org.
- 5. Coggins provided with stall entries will expedite the check-in process. All horses must be checked into the office accompanied by a negative Coggins prior to unloading unless provided in advance.
- 6. All riders must check into the office prior to riding. **Back numbers and ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn by all riders when mounted**. Back numbers will not be issued without an open check or credit card on file along with a signed liability release.
- 7. Ponies to be exhibited by adults only in open divisions with suitability considered.
- 8. In cases where a division offers more than one jump height, rider must confirm jump height by close of schooling. Same-day adds and scratches must be done at the office including additional Warmup rounds.
- 9. RCHJA can accept cash, check, or credit card (4% processing fee applies). Billing splits must be confirmed prior to the close of office hours the day before the start of the show. Returned checks and credit cards that are non-negotiable for any reason are subject to a \$40 return check fee. Repeat offenders may be barred from returning to RCHJA events.
- 10. Lead Line riders may cross enter into Walk division. Walk/Trot riders <u>may not</u> cross enter into Crossrails. WTC Crossrailers and Open WTC horse/rider combinations <u>may not</u> cross enter into any other division but may cross enter into Pleasure Horse/Pony or Model classes. Short Stirrup riders <u>may</u> not cross enter into any other hunter divisions.
 - 11. Lead Line and Warmup classes not rated for year-end awards.
 - 12. Points will be awarded as follows: First 10, Second 6, Third 4, Fourth 2, Fifth 1, Sixth ½, Champion 20, Reserve Champion 12. Champion/Reserve Champion ribbons to be awarded for all divisions aside from Warmup, Lead Line, Pleasure and Model classes. Points will not be awarded in jumper divisions for Champion/Reserve ribbons.
 - 13. Division/Class splits left to the discretion of Management.

Gate calls will be enforced without exceptions.





For and in consideration of River City Hunter Jumper Association, LLC ("RCHJA") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in RCHJA sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("RCHJA Event" or "RCHJA Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

- **A. RULES AND REGULATIONS:** I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable bylaws, rules, and policies as published at www.rchja.org as amended from time to time.
- B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any RCHJA Event involves risks and dangers including, with- out limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the RCHJA Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

1 Who Should Be in the Arena

2 Ring Capacity

Arena are limited to mounted riders, trainers and their assistants. We ask that all family members and spectators enjoy the view from outside the arena.

Rings are limited to 6 riders at any given time. We encourage use of the surrounding warm up areas to flat in preparation for schooling over fences.

3 Common Riding Expectations

4 Lunging

Riders should enter and exit at a walk, passing left shoulder to left shoulder, leaving the rail for flat riders and staying on the inside tracks when jumping.

Lunging should be performed in the provided area across from the small indoor arena. No lunging should be performed in the grass or in the vicinity of mounted riders.

5 Red Ribbons and Blinkers

6 Show Day Schooling

Horses displaying red ribbons or wearing blinkers should be provided generous space and consideration. Riders should commit to only one of the provided fences for schooling and should not bridge the gap between the two designated areas. Priority is given to competitors over hack/trial rides.

7 Photography

8 Cell Phone Usage

A professional photographer has been retained to capture the horse show. Professional grade photography equipment is discouraged.

The use of cellphones is prohibited in the arenas or schooling rings.

(600A/B/C) Serenity Farm Hunt Team Competition – teams of two will compete for a team score by each performing one over fence hunter round to be scored on the standard scale. The two individual scores are then added together to create the team score. Medals are awarded to: Gold, Bronze and Silver Placings. Class to be offered to (A) junior & amateur horse/rider combinations to show over crossrails which can be trotted or cantered, (B) junior & amateur horse/rider combinations to show at 2'/2'3", and (C) all riders to show at 2'6"/3'. Team members must jump within the same section but team members may jump different heights (for example, one rider may jump 2' and the other may jump 2'3" as classes 600B and 600C are offered at two heights).

(601A/B/C) HaddenLoch Jump Team Competition – teams of two will compete for a team score by each performing one speed round. The two individual scores in terms of both time and faults are then added together to create the team score. Medals are awarded to: Gold, Bronze and Silver placings. Class to be offered to (A) junior & amateur horse/rider combinations to show over crossrails, (B) junior & amateur horse/rider combinations to show at .65m/.75m, and (C) open to all riders to show at .85m/.95m. Team members must jump within the same section but team members may jump different heights (for example, one rider may jump .65m and another may jump .75m as classes 602B and 602C are offered at two heights).

You will map your own course over the allowed fences whose individual point value is based on fence height and/or difficulty. Lowering of an obstacle results in no points awarded for that obstacle and it may not be attempted again. At the conclusion of the time allowed the rider will be given the option to attempt the Joker for a bonus point gamble. The rider that accumulates the most points in the time allowed wins. Jumps may be attempted from either direction but may not be jumped more than twice in a single course. The time allowed, point values and course design will be provided at least one hour prior to start time. Horse/rider combinations may not cross-enter into more than one Gambler's Choice. Costumes are welcomed and encouraged for a fun night under the lights!

To be judged on conformation, athleticism, way of movement, quality, soundness & suitability for the hunter ring. Offered to Horses (1), Ponies (2) & Hunter Breeding (3) under the age of 5 years old. Classes may be combined based on entries. Hunter Breeding entrants may be exhibited in a halter & lead rope.

(4) Lead Line

Open to junior riders who have not independently walked in a show. To be exhibited at the walk on a lead rope by an adult.

UNDER SADDLE DIVISIONS

(5, 6, 7) Walk

Open to junior & amateur riders who have not trotted in a show. Division will be comprised of Walk Hunter Under Saddle (5), Walk Equitation (6) & Walk Poles (7). Poles to be exhibited one at a time. Riders may be accompanied by adult supervision in the ring during the classes.

(8, 9, 10) Walk Trot 9 & Under

Open to junior riders ages 9 & under as of December 1 that have not cantered at a show. Division will be comprised of Walk Trot Hunter Under Saddle (8), Walk Trot Equitation (9) & Walk Trot Poles (10). Poles to be exhibited one at a time. Riders may not cross enter into any over fence divisions.

(11, 12, 13) Walk Trot 10-17

Open to junior riders ages 10-17 as of December 1 that have not cantered at a show. Division will be comprised of Walk Trot Hunter Under Saddle (11), Walk Trot Equitation (12) & Walk Trot Poles (13). Poles to be exhibited one at a time. Riders may not cross enter into any over fence divisions.

(14, 15, 16) Walk Trot Adult

Open to amateur riders that have not cantered at a show. Division will be comprised of Walk Trot Hunter Under Saddle (14), Walk Trot Equitation (15) & Walk Trot Poles (16). Poles to be exhibited one at a time. Riders may not cross enter into any over fence divisions.

(17, 18, 19) Open Walk Trot Canter

Open to horse/rider combinations who have not yet jumped in a show. Division will be comprised of Hunter Under Saddle (17), Pleasure (18) & Poles (19). Poles to be exhibited one at a time at trot or canter. Horse/Rider combination may not cross enter into any over fence classes.

(20, 21) Pleasure

To be judged on performance, versatility, responsiveness, soundness & manners. Offered to Horses (20) & Ponies (21).

LIMITED HUNTER DIVISIONS

*(50, 51, 52) WT Crossrails

Open to horse/rider combinations that have not jumped over 18" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (50, 51) & one under saddle class (52). Horse/Rider combination may not cross enter into any other divisions aside from WT Crossrails Equitation.

*(80, 81, 82) WTC Crossrails

Open to horse/rider combinations that have not jumped over 18" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (80, 81) & one under saddle class (82). Fences & lead changes may be trotted. Horse/Rider combination may not cross enter into any other divisions aside from WTC Crossrails Equitation, Puddle Jumpers and Pleasure.

(53, 54, 55) Beginner Hunter

Fences to be set at 18" — open to all horse/rider combinations that have not jumped over 2' at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (53, 54) & an under saddle class (55). May trot lead changes. No in & outs. No oxers.

*(56, 57, 58) Short/Long Stirrup Hunter

Fences to be set at 2′ – open to junior & amateur riders that have not jumped over 2′ at a show. Short Stirrup is limited to riders 11 & under as of December 1. Long Stirrup is limited to riders 12 & over as of December 1. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (56, 57) & an under saddle class (58). Division will be split by age group at management discretion. No in & outs. No oxers.

(62, 63, 64) Intermediate Rider Hunter

Fences to be set at 2'3" – open to all junior & amateur riders who have not jumped over 2'6" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (62, 63) & an under saddle class (64). No in & outs.

*(68, 69, 70) Children's Hunter Pony

Fences to be set at 2', 2'3" or 2'6" – open to junior riders. Riders may elect the height of their choosing. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (68, 69) & an under saddle class (70). No in & outs.

*(71, 72, 73) Low Children's/Adult Hunter

Fences to be set at 2'6" or 2'9" – open to junior & adult amateur horse/rider combinations that have not jumped over 2'9" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (71, 72) & an under saddle class (73). Division will be split by age group at management discretion. No in & outs.

*(74, 75, 76) Children's/Adult Amateur Hunter

Fences to be set at 3' or 3'3" – open to junior & adult amateur horse/rider combinations that have not jumped over 3'3" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (74, 75) & an under saddle class (76). Division will be split by age group at management discretion.

OPEN HUNTER DIVISIONS

(59, 60, 61) RCHJA Hunter 2'/2'3

Fences to be set at 2' or 2'3. Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (59, 60) & an under saddle class (61).

(65, 66, 67) RCHJA Hunter 2'6"/2'9"

Fences to be set at 2'6" or 2'9". Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (65, 66) & an under saddle class (67).

(77, 78, 79) RCHJA Hunter 3'/3'3"

Fences to be set at 3' or 3'3". Division will be comprised of two over fence hunter rounds (77, 78) and an under saddle class (79).

EQUITATION DIVISIONS

(200, 201, 202) WT Crossrails Equitation

Open to junior and amateur horse/rider combinations who have not jumped over 18" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (200, 201) & one equitation flat class (202). Riders may not cross enter into any other divisions aside from WT Crossrails Hunter.

(203, 204, 205) WTC Crossrails Equitation

Open to junior and amateur horse/rider combinations who have not jumped over 18" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (203, 204) & one equitation flat class (205). Fences & lead changes may be trotted. Riders may not cross enter into any other divisions aside from WTC Crossrails Hunter, Puddle Jumpers and Pleasure.

(209, 210, 211) Beginner Rider Equitation

Fences to be set at 18" – open to junior & amateur horse/rider combinations that have not jumped over 2' at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (209, 210) & an equitation flat class (211). May trot lead changes. No in & outs. No oxers.

(212, 213, 214) Short/Long Stirrup Equitation

Fences to be set at 2' - open to junior & amateur horse/rider combinations that have not jumped over 2'3 at a show. Short Stirrup is limited to riders 11 & under as of December 1. Long Stirrup is limited to riders 12 & over as of December 1. Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (212, 213) & an equitation flat class (214). Division will split by age group at management discretion. No in & outs. No oxers.

(215, 216, 217) Intermediate Rider Equitation

Fences to be set at 2'3" - open to all junior & amateur horse/rider combinations who have not jumped over 2'6" at a show. Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (215, 216) & an equitation flat class (217). No in & outs.

(218, 219, 220) Children's Pony Equitation

Fences to be set at 2', 2'3" or 2'6" — open to junior horse/rider combinations. Riders may elect the height of their choosing, but may not have previously shown elected mount above the next highest option from selected jump height (i.e. 2' riders may not have shown over 2'3). Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (218, 219) & an equitation flat class (220). No in & outs.

(221, 222, 223) Low Children's/Low Adult Equitation

Fences to be set at 2'6" or 2'9" – open to junior & amateur horse/rider combinations. Horse/Rider combination may not have previously shown above the next highest option from selected jump height (i.e. 2'6" horse/rider combo may not have shown over 2'9"). Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (221, 222) & an equitation flat class (223). Division will be split by age group at management discretion. No in & outs.

(224, 225, 226) Children's/Adult Equitation

Fences to be set at 3' or 3'3" – open to junior & amateur horse/rider combinations. Horse/Rider combination may not have previously shown above the next highest option from selected jump height (i.e. 3' horse/rider combo may not have shown over 3'3"). Division will be comprised of two over fence equitation rounds (224, 225) & an equitation flat class (226). Division will be split by age group at management discretion.

JUMPER CLASSES

(300, 301) Puddle Jumper Crossrails Fences to be set as cross rails.

Open to all riders. Division will run under an optimum time format. No combinations or oxers.

(302, 303) Beginner Jumper .55m Fences to be set at .55m

Open to all riders. Division will run under an optimum time format. No combinations or oxers.

(304, 305) Novice Jumper .65m Fences to be set at .65m.

Open to all riders. Division will run under an optimum time format. No combinations or oxers.

(306, 307) Modified Jumper .75m

Fences to be set at .75m.

Open to all riders. Division will run under an optimum time format. No combinations.

*(308, 309) Hopeful Jumper .85m Fences to be set at .85m. Open to all riders.

*(310, 311) Training Jumper .95m/1.0m Fences to be set at .95m or 1m. Open to all riders.

*(312, 313) Open Jumper 1.05m/1.10m Fences to be set at 1.05m or 1.10m. Open to all riders.

MEDAL CLASSES

*(400) SEMF Qualifier

Fences to be set at 2' or 2'3" – medal class open to all junior & amateur horse/rider combinations who have not jumped over 2'3" at a show. Riders to show over a full over fences course followed by a test of the top 6 riders. Test may be over fences or on the flat at the judge's discretion. Test may include a multitude of questions including but not limited to trot fences, hand gallop, dismounting, jogging & verbal questions.

*(401) SEMF Qualifier

Fences to be set at 2'6" or 2'9" – medal class open to all junior & amateur horse/rider combinations who have not jumped over 2'9" at a show. Riders to show over a full over fences course followed by a test of the top 6 riders. Test may be over fences or on the flat at the judge's discretion. Test may include a multitude of questions including but not limited to rollbacks, trot fences, hand gallop, dismounting, jogging & verbal questions.

*(402) SEMF Qualifier

Fences to be set at 3' or 3'3" - medal class open to all junior & amateur horse/rider combinations who have not jumped over 3'3" at a show. Riders to show over a full over fences course followed by a test of the top 6 riders. Test may be over fences or on the flat at the judge's discretion. Test may include a multitude of questions including but not limited to rollbacks, trot fences, hand gallop, dismounting, jogging & verbal questions.

WARM UP CLASSES

(500, 501, 502, 503) Warm Up – un-judged round to be performed at the beginning of entered division. Horse/rider combination is limited to one warm up round up per ring/per day of competition.

SOUTHEAST MEDAL FINALS SANCTIONED EVENT Comparable medal, equitation, hunter & jumper classes where the specifications & height are the same or similar will count towards qualification
