



#### **Parade Shtick and Best Practices**

Parade Season is upon us. Here are some ideas to help prepare you for the fun. First consider the weather. If it is rainy and cold wear water repellent clothing. Maybe that pristine competition costume is not the best idea. If it is August wear sweat-wicking materials. Maybe that hot wig should be reconsidered. You can wear a vest instead of a jacket. Drink lots of water and stay cool. You are not entertaining if you're not comfortable.

Parades are a great way to practice walk around Shtick. This is free range clowning at its best! If you bomb 10 yards further down the street is another chance at it. Do not be afraid to try new ideas. Remember to keep what you do family friendly. Please put in context of would I want someone saying or doing that to my wife, sister, mother, or daughter?

Timing is also important. You should not hold up the parade behind you. And you should keep up with the parade ahead. Stay in your unit do not infringe on the unit behind or ahead of you. If you see a fellow clown doing something with people do not step on the gag. Show respect for your fellow clowns and let them finish before you start yours.

You can also team up for gags. One of my favorites is Yahoo; the best part is no prop needed.2-4 clowns split up on opposite sides of the street. One side of the Crowd is instructed to yell "Ya". The other side is instructed to yell "Hoo".

After you get them to do this a couple of times you look at each other and say "Let's go nothing but a bunch of Yahoos here"

Here is short lists of ideas steal them and make them your own. These gags also are great for Circus, festivals or other events where a Quick gag is needed

- Old fashioned Phone prop needed "You don't say, you don't say, really you don't say .Well good bye". Second Clown asks "who was it " First Clown says "I don't know they didn't say "
- 2. Old fashioned Phone prop needed take a selfie with the crowd on your old school phone prop. Tell them it instantly developed. Give them a sticker or your picture card. "That turned out Great!"
- 3. Put a foam Hot dog and bun in an invisible leash. It's your wiener dog. His name is Frank. You relish his companionship. He is lagging behind, but he will ketchup. The puns keep on going
- 4. Put a 350 Balloon dog in an invisible leash (a 260 is too small) Have him roll over sit stay and other tricks.
- 5. This is an election year. Make a sign "Vote (your clown name) for President! Put a real Clown in the White house"
- 6. The lost pet gag is always a good one. Print off a big Picture of a stuffed animal. Put it on a sign Lost Dog, cat, monkey or whatever you have. Attach it to your back. Turn around let the kids find it and let the fun begin.
- 7. Free Chicken Dinner. Take a KFC, or other brand, Chicken bucket. Offer the crowd a free Chicken dinner. When they say Ok give them unpopped popcorn. This same gag can be done with a free fish dinner using gummy worms.

- 8. Find an empty Lawn Chair with people around it sit down and watch the parade with them.

  Complain about the traffic being terrible. Make sure there is time for Pictures before you do this.
- Pass out foam or printed Letter "B"s "Here have a freebie". Free Brown "E"s also work
- 10. One simpler inexpensive prop is Free Washer Dryer. Buy a bag of Clothes pins glue a washer on them

These are all simple inexpensive gags you can walk around in a parade with. They are not original but when you put your personal twist on them they become yours!
