The 7th Article on the Call was to allow a non-Freemason to become a Shriner. I voted

against. The 7th Article Failed. The rest of the Call was of Housekeeping, Changes in jurisdiction, adding new Temples, use of internet video telephonic service for meetings and adding "declared disaster" to National Emergency protocol. Most of these Articles passed or was withdrawn. Note: I did vote against the use of internet video telephonic service and adding "declared disaster" to the National Emergency protocol. I do feel I voted in the best interest of our Nobels Fraternity and Philanthropy. If you have any questions on how I voted please feel free to ask. Just a recommendation, think about buying a lifetime membership for your Per Capita. This may help with two things, saving you money in the long run and infusing money needed for Investments for International Fraternal operation cost. I do believe they will ask for an increase in per capita tax next year... Again, Thank You for allowing me to be a Voting Representative for our Fraternity and Shriners Hospitals for Children.



Born December 23, 1945—Died June 2, 2021

Norman J. Mick was born in Hamilton. Ohto on December 23, 1945. He received a strong religious family upbringing from his parents, Elimer N. and Anna Mick. He attended St. Ann's purchial school in his formative years. He later graduated from Hamilton Catholic High School. His family's strong religious background led him to attend St. Gregory Seminary to search out his vocational calling. Later he went on to study Basiness Administration and Accounting at Xavier University.

His vocational path encompassed business and financial ventures for several years. He retired several years ago after spending over thirtyfive years with Dubois Chemicals of Cincinnati, Ohio.

Norman met Lois G. Miller through mutual friends, and they married in November of 1966. They have three children, Anna (Ronald) Herrmann, Elizabeth (Tom) Feller and Christopher Mick. This resulted in eight grandchildren, Kyle Covert, Kristim Covert, Tyler Mick, Evelyn Herrmann, Holly Herrmann, Anthony Herrmann, Michael Mick and Jayden Mick. Norman and Lois currently attend St. John the Baptist Church in Harrison, Ohio. In previous Parishes, he served when needed as liturgist and on various contmittees and served as Fall Festival Chairman for many years. He spent several years in the Taylor Creek Youth Organization coaching soccer and softball for his children and served five years as the Boys Soccer Coordinator.

It was while working at Dubots Chemicals that he became associated with several Masons, which led to his joining Hoffner Lodge No. 253 in the fall of 1982. He is proud to have received many Honorary Memberships. His thirst for Masonic knowledge led him to join the York Rite and Scottish Rite in 1983. He served Cumminsville Chapter No. 158 R.A.M. as High Priest in 1987 and 1994. He was appointed to serve as District Deputy Grand High Priest in 1991, 1992 and 1993. MEC Terry Mayors appointed him as Grand Guard for the Grand Chapter R.A.M. in 1998. He was Illustrious Master of Cincinnati Council No. 1 R.S.M. in 1998. While advancing in that line, he served four years as co-chairman of the Scottish Rite Pamily Life Program. He was coroneted a Thirty-Third Degree Mason of the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite, Northern Masonie Jurisdiction in September 2003 at their annual session in St. Louis, Missouri.

Most Worshipful Brother Mick also served as President of the Fourth Capitalar District R.A.M. in 1990 and President of the First Masonic District in 1992, as well as President of the Society of Past Masters of Cincinnati and Vicinity. He is a past Sovereign Master of Seven Hills Council, Allied Masonic Degrees, a Past Governor and recipient of the Order of the Purple Cross in Miami Valley York Rite College and was currently serving as Pussant Sovereign of St. Columba Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine. He and Lois served the Order of Eastern Star as Worthy Patron and Worthy Matron of Marion Chapter No. 318 in 1991 and are current members of Marion Chapter No. 376 He was also a member of Temple Tabernacle #LXII, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, and Irish Council #67, Knight Masons.

While serving in the First Masonic District officer line, he was asked, as a Shriner, to join a committee in 1989 to reorganize a yearly pregame event with the Cincinnati Reds Baseball Team and Syrian Shrine Temple. He worked with Illustrious Sir Charles Settles as co-chairman from 1998 and became Chairman of the event and Master of Ceremonies for the pre-game coeremonies in 1996, concluding 30 years of service to that event in 2019.

He served the Grand Lodge of Ohio as District Deputy Grand Master 2005-2006. Most Worshipful Brother Michael A. Himes appointed ed him as Junior Grand Deacon in October 2006.
