






The University of Cincinnati is on track to acquire the former Shriners Hospital for Children, a 30-bed facility with a 50-year history on Burnet Avenue.

Shriners Hospital, known for its burn treatment center, announced its plans to move to Dayton, Ohio, last summer. The Corryville building is on the crest of Pill Hill, between Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center and UC.

The property used to belong to UC. UC and Shriners decided to swap land parcels in 1987 to make room for what is now Shriners Hospital. Shriners Burns Institute, the institute's original facility, opened in 1968. That building is now UC's French East Hall, at the northeast corner of Eden Avenue and Goodman Street.

Robert Ambach, UC's senior vice president for administration and finance, told The Enquirer that the building "piqued their interest" when Shriners announced its move in 2019. The university is still in negotiations with Shriners, though Ambach says the deal will likely close sometime in 2021 at around \$38 to \$41 million. The price will be determined based on appraisals at 80% of the fair market value.
