



Braxton and his mom still consider their trip to Shriners Children's Ohio a 'Christmas miracle'

Christmas Day 2017 wasn't the magical time Kristin Grimmett hoped the holiday would be. She was in a van with strangers, driving to a hospital six hours away with her young son who had an open burn wound.

Two Roadrunners drove them from Tennessee because Braxton still had a burn wound on his head after he reached for a pot of boiling water.

Braxton says the team makes him feel "special." There isn't much hair left on Braxton's scalp, so when bullies started to bother him at school, Shriners took immediate steps by finding funding to get a custom hair piece. Braxton's mom says he is much more confident and likes that he can take off the hairpiece when he gets too hot.

"They definitely spoiled him but he deserves it," Kristin said. "This all started Christmas all those years ago and they still help us and make sure we're okay."

Reni travels thousands of miles to keep care with Shriners Children's Lexington

Sometimes it's all about who you know.

For 12-year-old Reni, it really came down to who his parents knew.

Reni's parents, Cydil and Nathan, were looking to adopt. They hadn't initially considered the possibility of adopting a child with a limb difference, but when Reni's file was presented to them, they felt a strong sense that it was meant to be.

Reni was born without most of his legs. While they aren't totally sure, Reni's parents suspect his condition was the result of amniotic band syndrome, which is when the inner layer of the placenta is damaged during pregnancy and those strands of tissue become tangled around the baby, restricting blood flow to that part of the body sometimes

stunting growth. In Reni's case, it is believed the amniotic bands amputated both of his legs above the knee.

It seems that it really was meant to be for Reni and his parents, since one of Cydil and Nathan's close friends, Faith Powers, is a social worker at the just the place to provide the specialized care for Reni.

"When sharing about the possibility of adopting Reni, Faith informed us that Shriners Hospital in Lexington treated children with limb differences like Reni," Cydil said. "It felt like one of those pieces of confirmation that we were to proceed with Reni's adoption — that God had provided the resources a child like Reni might need — and practically in our back yard."

So, in 2010, Cydil and Nathan traveled to Albania to celebrate Reni's first birthday with him in the orphanage, complete the adoption process and bring him to the U.S., knowing that when they got home, SHCMC would be there to help.

"Shriners was a big answer to prayer for us," Nathan said. "Our first question when we were presented Reni's file was whether we could find the resources he needed. Finding out that Shriners was close to home was a huge weight off our shoulders."
