

Courageous Cheyenne calls her experience at Shriners Children's Ohio a 'badge of honor'

Cheyenne has proven she can find her courage in the toughest of situations.

As a two-time world champion in sport karate, she has overcome every challenge. Her determination was tested when she started experiencing jaw pain that made it difficult to eat and even caused sleep apnea. It turns out her lower jaw was underdeveloped and required major surgery to fix it. However, her dad says insurance considered the procedure cosmetic.

Thankfully, the family reached out to Shriners Children's Ohio and learned the clinical team could provide the care they needed regardless of the family's ability to pay. Cheyenne says, although the recovery process was long and at times painful, she no longer has jaw pain and considers the experience a "badge of honor."

Cheyenne says she feels even more confident to face the next challenge with more courage than ever.

Iker doesn't believe in the word, "can't."

"I'm very smart," the spirited 7-year-old said. "I can do anything."

Iker's parents, Alfonso and Abigail, found out he had a congenital lower limb deficiency via an ultrasound.

"We knew he was going to be born missing his right leg," Alfonso said. "We started looking everywhere for help."

Iker's family moved to the U.S. from Mexico and were living in Tennessee when he was born. They knew he would need specialized care for his limb difference.

"I had a friend who still lived in Mexico and told me he took his kid to the Shriners hospital in Mexico City for clubfoot," Alfonso said. "He recommended we look for Shriners in the U.S."

The Lexington Shriners medical center was closest at the time, and the family instantly felt at home.

"They have treated us like family since day one," Alfonso said.

Iker sees Janet Walker, M.D. He also sees the Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services – Midwest housed in Lexington. He started using a prosthetic leg when he was 11 months old, and recently received his third prosthetic.

Iker's family has since moved to Michigan, which requires a 7-hour trip to Lexington. His parents explored orthopedic and prosthetic providers closer to their new home, but decided Shriners is where Iker belongs.

"Everything Shriners has and does is special – the team, the kindness of the people," Abigail said. "It's the best place for kids with special needs like Iker."

Iker is in first grade and loves playing freeze tag with his friends on the school playground. His favorite subject in school is math. Overall, Iker is thriving.

"We set out looking for the very best option for our son," Alfonso said. "And Shriners has been it."
