Governor Abbott,

We write to you as a coalition of duly elected Members of the Texas House of Representatives requesting you immediately use the authority at your disposal to save millions of Texas families from going hungry until federal funding to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is restored.

As you are aware, the ongoing federal government shutdown has forced the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to suspend all SNAP benefits beginning November 1st. This action will immediately strip food assistance from 3.5 million Texans, including 1.7 million children, and remove more than \$617 million in monthly food purchasing power from our state's economy. In fact, for every \$1 spent with SNAP benefits, the Texas economy gets \$1.54 back. This is a vital source of revenue for our small retailers and grocers across the state.

Families who rely on SNAP to feed their children and seniors who depend on it for groceries will have nowhere to turn. Our regional food banks do incredible and critical work, but they have nowhere near the infrastructure nor funding to replace the federal government's food assistance programs.

The USDA has stated plainly that "the well has run dry," and that states may not continue issuing SNAP benefits with the expectation of eventual federal reimbursement. However, states do have the power to take temporary emergency measures, using state funds to prevent hunger and stabilize families while Congress resolves the federal impasse. Governors in Louisiana and Virginia have already taken decisive action to protect their residents during this period of uncertainty. Texas should do the same.

We know there have been reports that USDA is unwilling to provide the infrastructure support to distribute SNAP dollars in states choosing to cover the cost themselves during this time of uncertainty. If this is the case, we urge President Trump to not allow his appointed leaders at USDA to let millions of children go hungry.

We therefore respectfully request that you declare a state of emergency and authorize the temporary use of state funds to maintain SNAP benefits for Texas households until the federal government resumes normal operations.

Texas has long been a leader among states. We also have the advantage of a prosperous economy and robust emergency savings. With the political gridlock in Washington, D.C., this crisis calls for swift, compassionate leadership worthy of our state's values and strength.

Texas families are counting on us. We urge you to act now.

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

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
