You can change to electronic voting by updating your information on the Ninety-nines website in the member's section. (I find that I do not get the full menu when I first log into the member's section. If I click on any menu item (ie member benefits) and then go back down to the list I will have the full list.) Please remember to vote. It is important.

One more thing, please come join us at the Spring Section meeting March 27-29. Registration has started. Price is \$110 before 3/15, and \$125 after. If you have never attended a section meeting and would like some financial help, let me or another board member know, as the Chapter does have a "scholarship" for a first-time attendee. The meeting is not too far away being in Batavia, OH near Cincinnati. It is the home of Sporty's Pilot Shop too!

## STUDENT PILOT UPDATE

**From Maddie S:** Happy New Year! I have some amazing news to share with the group. On Christmas Eve, I passed my Private Pilot Checkride. Best Christmas gift ever! I attached a photo for the newsletter :)

**What is a common misconception about being a Pilot that you'd like to debunk?** "Small planes are unsafe". Now that I have spent about 75 hours in various 172's, there are always risks but I've found experience, thorough maintenance, and decision-making matter more than size.

**On average, how many hours do you fly or spend on ground school in a typical week/month?** On average, I am flying 2x a week with 1 ground lesson. I also try to study at least one hour on weekdays and a bit more on weekends.

**To date, what has been the best advice you've received from your Instructor or a fellow Pilot?** A piece of advice that really stuck with me was to get in the habit of always thinking a step or two ahead. Doing small things early, like loading frequencies or checking weather and altimeter settings in advance, makes flying feel more manageable. When it's time for takeoff or landing, you can focus on flying instead of scrambling.

### **Richard J. Santori Memorial Scholarship**

The Richard J. Santori Memorial Scholarship offers two annual scholarships to members of the North Central Section (“NCS”) under the auspices of The Chicago Area Chapter of The Ninety-Nines (“CAC”).

One scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 is to be used to assist a 99 in the completion of an additional pilot certificate or rating. Applicant must be a current pilot with the appropriate medical certificate.

The other scholarship offers \$1,000 to assist a Student Pilot Member toward completion of an initial pilot certificate in any aircraft. Applicants must have soloed, and, if required for the pilot certificate sought, must have a current medical certificate and must have passed the written exam.

Applicants must be a current member of The 99s, the NCS and their chapter in good standing.

Applicants must submit three (3) copies of each: the completed and signed application including the form; attached essay; letter of recommendation from their chapter chair; proof of certificates and ratings held; medical certificate; proof of date and score of knowledge tests taken; copy of last page(s) of logbook showing current hours flown; and a letter of reference from someone outside of the aviation community who is not a relative. These documents must be mailed to the address on the application form to be postmarked no later than the date indicated on the form.

Funds will be paid from receipts which document the training. Receipts must be signed by both the student and instructor and include copies of the logbook if applicable.

Funds are to be used within two years of the award date. Prior applicants and recipients may re-apply in future years.

The winning candidate and all candidates who did not qualify will be notified within one month after the receipt deadline.

On March 15, 2026, members will receive an invitation to vote in the international election for Officers, Directors, Trustees, and Nominating Committee members via email and text message (if you are registered for electronic voting), or via a printed ballot if you requested one. We are also looking at possible distribution of voting notifications using WhatsApp. We will update you when that is confirmed.

Choosing an electronic ballot helps The Ninety-Nines save on printing, mailing, and processing costs. If you are one of the members who still need to switch to electronic voting, please consider that every dollar saved can be reinvested in our various programs and outreach initiatives. Electronic voting is fast, secure, and convenient, making it easier than ever to have your voice heard in shaping our organization's future.
