STUDENT PILOT UPDATE REPORTS

Jill F has soloed in her gyroplane - watch her fly up at Kenosha! We ALL wish her well.

Sarah D is gaining proficiency with her takeoffs and becoming more comfortable in the air. She's still refining her basic flight controls and sight picture but feels things are starting to come together. She's found techniques to manage takeoff nerves and is becoming confident in her preflight procedures. She reports "I am conducting biomedical research at NASA on space-flight associated neuro-ocular syndrome (SANS). This is a cluster of findings seen in the majority of astronauts in long-duration spaceflight missions and remains a "red risk" - one that we have to gain a greater understanding of before embark-ing on deeper space missions to Mars. My lab does the bulk of the research on SANS at NASA, and right now I am looking at which factors contribute the most to someone developing SANS as well as which factors might be protective, to greater characterize who is most at risk of developing the condition. " Sarah is flying a Cessna 150 at LaPorte Muni in LaPorte TX working on her Private.

My most recent trips were over the past two weekends to attend events representing the Chicago Area Chapter. Sept 13-15, I flew my Piper Archer into Flying Cloud in Minneapolis with Madeleine M to attend the North Central Section Meeting. Beautiful VFR weather both ways. Lisa M and Madeleine flew with me the following weekend, when we honored chapter members Madeleine M and Gail L at the International Forest of Friendship in Atchison, KS. Since the Amelia Earhart Airport in Atchison is closed while a new runway is being built, we used Rosecrans Airport in St Joseph, Missouri. I filed IFR both ways but the flight out on Friday, Sept 20, was completely clear. The return flight on Sunday - not so much. We entered the clouds shortly after takeoff, and stayed in IMC and light to moderate rain for most of the 3.5 hour flight back to Campbell in Grayslake. It was a smooth flight, despite the rain, and was a great learning experience for passenger Lisa while she works on her IFR rating.

Several of our active members are almost ready for checkrides. I expect that we will hear about their progress soon!
