The Chicago Area Chapter began assisting the State of Illinois, Department of Transportation, Division of Aeronautics, Safety Office to put on an IFR/VFR Safety Seminar with Flying Companion Course about 50 years ago. When I joined the 99s way back when, Char Falkenberg and Joan Kerwin were teaching Flying Companions at the IDOT event in Springfield. Over the years Beverlee Greenhill, Sharon Schorsch, Marge Sundmacher, Gail Wenk, Rita Adams and others led the charge. On January 25, 2025 our Chapter produced the event, chose the venue, lined up the educational speakers, arranged for Wings credits, provided publicity, invited aviation businesses and charities to help funding by purchasing table space, designed a new Flying Companion interactive 4 session experience (Jen M and Jamie S) and presented Aviation Expo 2025 to the public.

Our Vendor Chairperson, Mary Lou E sold more than 30 table spaces for charitable organizations and aviation businesses. These funds pay for the hotel room rental, and are supplemented by some generous donations: from IDOT and a few others.

Our speakers covered a weather presentation on winter flying/icing conditions for both IFR and VFR pilots; a comprehensive IFR review for the Instrument pilots, an ATC Tracon veteran controller, an AME, a presentation on exquisite landings, an interactive session on what choices you have after you earn your private certificate, and a problem solving presentation on system malfunctions.

We educated upwards of 300 people. We (Cynthia M & Karen B) recruited new 99s, and our vendors increased membership, sales and public relations visibility.

This event was well presented, well respected and well worth the effort it takes to put on.

She particularly enjoyed practicing short and soft field takeoffs and landings. Her journey highlighted the importance of hard work and support, proving that progress comes with persistence. On Christmas Eve, she passed her checkride and became a private pilot.

To stay confident, she has been revisiting basic maneuvers while reminding herself that everything happens for a reason. In Memory of Cecile Hadfield

Cecile Schwebel Hatfield, has completed her final journey. A trailblazing aviator and attorney, she shattered glass ceilings in both aviation and law.

Her aviation passion ignited dramatically in 1962. Just two months after her son's birth, she confronted her fear of flying at Miami's Opa Locka airport. Her flight instructor had previously co-piloted for Amelia Earhart—a fitting connection to our organization's roots. Within a year, she earned her private pilot's license and ground-school instructor certificate.

Cecile became a prominent member of The Ninety-Nines, International Organization of Women Pilots, serving as our legal counsel for decades. She participated in the Intercontinental Women's Air

Derby, serving as an unofficial goodwill ambassador, even delivering presidential letters across the Western Hemisphere. Her flying was so impressive that Vice President Hubert Humphrey once offered her a job as his personal pilot.

Professionally, Cecile's legal career was equally remarkable. She served nine years in the U.S. Department of Justice, leading complex air carrier lawsuits and overseeing aviation attorneys at the Federal Aviation Admin-istration. Her landmark Supreme Court case, Varig v. United States (1984), remains a critical legal reference addressing the discretionary function exception to the Federal Tort Claims Act.

She was a groundbreaking first: the first woman to chair the American Bar Association's Aviation and Space Law Committee and the first woman to serve as Associate General Counsel for Piper Aircraft Corporation.

Her achievements were widely recognized. The International Association of Women in Aviation honored her with the 2015 Aviation Industry Woman of Excellence Award. Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University established the Award for Excellence in Aviation Law in her name.

May her pioneering spirit continue to inspire generations of women in aviation.
