99s 2025 Proposed Bylaw and Standing Rule Amendments

To Members of The 99s.

The 99s 2025 annual meeting will be held on Saturday July 12. To promote the widest possible attendance, the meeting will use a hybrid format (both in-person and online). Members will consider and vote on three (3) proposed amendments to the international bylaws and standing rules.

Per the bylaws, proposed amendments must be sent to governors, chapter chairmen, and members-at-large at least 60 days in advance of the annual meeting. However, The 99s International Bylaws and Standing Rules Committee would like <u>all</u> members of The 99s to be informed of these proposed amendments. This will help you to actively participate in discussions at the section or chapter level and at the annual meeting, and be more prepared for voting.

REPRINTED FROM **CALLBACK**

ASRS's award winning publication *CALLBACK* is a monthly safety newsletter, which includes de-identified ASRS report excerpts with supporting commentary in a popular "lessons learned" format. In addition, *CALLBACK* may contain features on ASRS research studies and related aviation safety information. The mission of ASRS is to disseminate information to the proper authorities who can investigate and determine if action is warranted.

Part 91 – "...Wisdom Listens." This FBO AMT listened while towing a Piper Seminole. Inquisitive and proactive, the Technician discovered and corrected a serious problem with the wheel assembly.

"During tow operations, I had noticed a noise coming from the left main landing gear. The wheel cover was removed, and the axle nut was found rolling loose inside of the cover without a safety device. I removed the wheel assembly and inspected for damage. Upon inspection I found that both wheel bearings were damaged. I cleaned and inspected the rest of the wheel assembly for any other damage, but no other damage was found. The wheel assembly was then reassembled with new bearings with appropriate grease, and a new tire tube. The wheel assembly was then reinstalled on the aircraft, and I ensured this time that the axle nut was tightened properly and a correct safety device was installed. "

A reminder that all of our senses are valuable when assessing the state of the aircraft and if the pilot! Eyes, ears, nose, touch and especially brain should be engaged.
