The Ninety-Nines: The view from an International Altitude

In my first years as a 99, I didn't have much of an understanding of the organization overall, apart from getting to know my fellow sister members in my Chicago Area Chapter. The 'International' part seemed like some alternate universe, accessible only to those with much longer tenures than mine.

And then, at a chapter meeting at Palwaukee Airport (yes, I said Palwaukee!) I got curious.

Curious about "where was my membership fee going each year, anyway?" Curious about "What did this mythical Oklahoma City headquarters look like?" "What's that Compass Rose and Museum of Women Pilots that longer-term members keep talking about?" "What is all this International stuff?"

So, I set out to find out..... one day, I packed a bag to attend one of the famed International Board meetings, held at Ninety-Nines headquarters in Oklahoma City. As a Ninety-Nine, I had a right to attend if I wanted – even if I didn't know exactly what all happened there.

Once I got there, I began to learn about, and see, the broader organization I was a part of – our organization's history, going back to 1929; both of our museums (the Museum of Women Pilots in Oklahoma City, and the Amelia Earhart Birthplace Museum in Atchison, Kansas); the Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship Fund, that has been awarding scholarships for the past eighty-one years (!); and the Endowment Fund. And I learned more about what it takes to keep an organization of this complexity and longevity on the straight and level; it wasn't easy!

At the same time, I got to meet our HQ staff and members who make it all run – the financials, the marketing and social media, the educational opportunities, the webinars, the conferences, the programs, the computer and communications structures, the preservation of our history; on a scale that went well beyond my own chapter. Just imagine... take what you know of the Ninety-Nines at the chapter level.... now expand that by a factor of 153 chapters... encompassing 44 countries, to accommodate over 6,500 members on every constantly inhabited continent on this planet!!

Mind Blown.

<u>That</u> is who the Ninety-Nines are; and these members, from around the world, were Absolutely Amazing. And I wanted to contribute to what they were doing.

I became an International Director in 2015. As a Director, flexibility is the name of the game! You are assigned to be an International Board liaison to one of the trusts/museums, which comes with an unprecedented front-row seat to learning more about those organizations; but you also get a number of projects assigned to advance the organization forward. My skills were in computers and financial things, so I got to play a key role in stabilizing our computer service and maintenance at headquarters; communication is critical! I've also participated in such diverse activities as upgrading information on the Speakers Bureau, used throughout the organization; and managing the Webinar Series, to bring education to our members electronically.

I took on the role of International Treasurer in 2018. The role encompasses lots of different functions; including but not limited to preparing and monitoring the Headquarters budget, (which involves constant communications up, down and sideways across the organization as new programs and initiatives are launched – and making it all make sense for members as well as Board members); ensuring that payroll of our HQ and museums' staff are accomplished on time; evaluating contracts for services; connecting with our treasurers at section and chapter levels as needed to provide guidance and support; and serving as a key lead on financially-focused initiatives for the organization, with programs that benefit all of the Ninety-Nines entities.

Seeing the Ninety-Nines at the international level, in any capacity (Board member, International Committee Chair or Committee member) was key to expanding my horizons, and fully understanding just how all-encompassing, strong, far-reaching and Awesome our organization is! To those who have not yet done so, I strongly recommend adding a 'vision upgrade' to your 99s viewpoint by checking out the International Level – and prepare to be amazed.
