March 19, 2017 Chicago Executive Airport, Atlantic Aviation Submitted by Jill Feldman, Secretary

Call to Order 12:05 pm by Chairman Ellen O'Hara. Welcome / Introductions – Welcomed members to Chicago Executive, and a special welcome to 99 member from Seattle, Bobbi Roe. Bobbi is Susan Kelsey's mom, and has been in multiple 99 chapters around the country for many years and is the editor of the 99 News. And Bobbi's mom was also a pilot!

A big thank-you to Madeleine Monaco and Rita Adams for co-hosting the meeting, setting up the clothing swap meet and for the donation of the remaining clothes to WINGS.

Secretary's Report- Meeting minutes from November 2016 (last formal meeting) were accepted as published in the Air News.

Treasurer's Report – February 2017 report and combined January - February Banking Summary presented by M. Monaco. January Treasurer's report provided by email to board in February. Safety Seminar made approx. \$1000 profit this year. New member 99s pins with propeller were purchased, but not invoiced until March, so will show up in next month's Banking summary. No formal comments on Treasurer's report. Accepted as presented and will be filed with minutes.

Committee Business/Reports

<u>Nominating Committee</u> – The committee of Donna Klein, Mary Lou Erikson and Sharon Schorsch (absent) stated that a full slate of candidates has been determined and the ballot will be included in the April newsletter. Ballot must be returned by May 1st.

A vote on the proposed amendment to the Standing Rules as submitted in a previous newsletter were voted on and accepted by all members present, with one verbiage correction. The reworded amendment is: "THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT(S) SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE MEMBERS AT LEAST THIRTY DAYS <u>PRIOR TO</u> THE MEETING." <u>Underlined</u> words added for clarification at the meeting and accepted.

Girl Scout Day – Co-chairs of this year's event on Saturday May 13th are Ellen O'Hara and Deb Meznarsic. As usual, there are six tables for the scouts to rotate through. A sign-up sheet was passed around the room. Key to the event is the use of a plane for the pre-flight station. Both Deb and Jill volunteered their planes, but since both are dependent on weather conditions, Ellen O'Hara will ask at the Lansing airport to see if there is a local plane that can be used as a backup. (Late breaking news – Ellen has lined up a Cessna 210 to use for the pre-flight station!) Six lead presenters are already assigned but we still need a second person for the History table with Donna Klein and the Navigation table with Leslie Prellwitz. Two 99s are needed for the registration table, which will then be set up as the Scout snacks table. Two 99s are needed for the Adult Snacks, which includes making coffee and providing coffee cakes and cookies. Any other 99s or significant others are always welcome as greeters and door watchers. Please contact Ellen and Deb if interested in helping the day of the event. Prices will be \$12/girl and \$5 per adult. Event is limited to the first 100 registrations. The event will be open to the boy scouts. 
HIGHLIGHTING OUR MEMBER

JILL FELDMAN

I had never really thought about being a pilot growing up — our family was involved in sailboat racing on the Great Lakes when I growing up in Rochester, NY. I never realized how much it was in my blood!

My first GA flight was in 1982, while at college at Purdue University in West Lafayette, IN. A guy I met at a party was a student and flight instructor at the university and asked if I wanted to go flying over the weekend. "Sure," I said — and after teaching me how to preflight the airplane and taking off, he said "Your airplane". "My airplane?" — but for the next hour I flew over campus — what a rush!

Fast forward another few decades and my husband Daniel and I are looking for an activity to replace the sailboat racing due to his back issues. Dan had originally wanted to be an Air Force pilot, but as that fell through after college, it didn't stop him from wanting to fly. My philosophy is if you really want to do something, then don't wait until someday – do it while you're young enough to enjoy it. So, in 2010 Dan started flying, and in 2013 when I told Dan I wanted to start flying also, we bought Belle, our 1947 Cessna 120.



I joined the Chicago Area 99s in September 2013, and although I fly frequently with my husband on the weekends and have a few hours of left seat lessons, I am still struggling to find time for lessons. I work in Compliance for a small start-up pharmaceutical company in downtown Chicago, and live in Libertyville, near the Wisconsin state line, so I commute 3 hours/day. But we still make time for the aviation activities we love –the fly-in breakfasts and "\$100 hamburgers", the 99s (Jill) and Civil Air Patrol (Dan). Together with our children we volunteer with EAA Young Eagles flights and take annual trips to AirVenture.

The 99s is a great organization to keep women flying with like-minded trailblazers, but also to encourage those of us who need that extra push to keep up with the lessons, to gain additional certifications, or to get up in the air anyway we can.
