## HIGHLIGHTING OUR MEMBER SHARON ANN SCHORSCH

On October 14th, 50 years ago, I received my private pilots license ( Just a month before our daughter, Ann Marie, was born and our son Cary turned one) I learned to fly in our new from the factory Piper Cherokee 140. My husband Frank and I purchased it with all the money we had saved from my teaching job. It was the beginning of our family's adventurous life. We flew everywhere we could. In 1973 we upgraded to a Cherokee 180 in which I got my instrument rating. Growing kids soon required a bigger plane. Welcome "Tingmissartoq II" (you'll have to look it up) a Cessna 206. Brand new in 1976, it was bought off the line at Dacy Airport. Since it came with a float kit, floats were put on in1980. Knowing this would eventually happen, I got my seaplane rating in 1978 (Frank already had his). Now the fun really started. Countless hunting/fishing trips to Canada, Northern Wisconsin



and Minnesota, and even Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories! Waders and life vests became top priorities in my wardrobe. I became thoroughly familiar with survival lists and camping gear.

I am blessed to have enjoyed those times for over 30 years. Frank passed away suddenly in November of 2011 while the 206 was in Watertown being painted—minus the floats. I picked it up the following January and still love to fly but now I wait for beautiful VFR days.

I have been a 99 since 1982 and have served on various committees and judged several NIFA Competitions. From 1988-90, I served as Chapter Chairman. I am currently our Chapter AE Scholarship Chairman.

I have never missed a year of Oshkosh (was at RFD before it moved). And I am also ongoing president of the Kenosha Pilots Association. Aviation continues to be an important part of my life.

## AVIATION EXPO VENDOR TABLES AVAILABLE

The Chicago Area Chapter Ninety-Nines, Inc., have hosted the largest safety seminar and aviation review day in Chicagoland for more than 30 years. Past attendance has exceeded 300 pilots.

Together with the Illinois Department of Transportation, we will be holding the 2018 Chicago Aviation Expo at the Holiday Inn Chicago West – Itasca, 860 W. Irving Park Road, Itasca, IL 60143, near the intersection of Irving Park Road (Hwy 19) and Hwy 53, south of Woodfield Mall.

The vendor area will be in the hotel atrium, which receives a large amount of traffic when participants arrive, during breaks and at lunchtime. Most tables have electricity available. Tables are 96" long and 34" deep, and will be covered and draped by the hotel. A buffet lunch will be available in the hotel restaurant to make it more attractive for participants to remain in the hotel and visit vendors. It will not be possible to tape or otherwise attach banners to the walls, so please plan your display accordingly with easels or other support for hanging materials. If you have a floor standing display, let us know so that we can remove the table, if necessary.

Vendor and Exhibitor displays will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and vendors may set up their booth space one hour early. Table space is available for \$100.00 per table.
