Six people flew to the event (Monaco, Eriksons, Cozzi/Kelly, and Thamina) even with the high temperature and gusty winds.

Welcome / Introductions – Welcomed new member Preethi Thamina. She received her PPL in January 2017 flying from Chicago Executive. Her favorite plane is the DA40 and 240 flight hours. Also welcomed future member Julie Richey. She has started her PPL twice – once ran out of money, second time ran out of time, but ready to try again. She is also a photographer and working on being an aero-photographer for the Civil Air Patrol.

Secretary's Report- May meeting minutes were accepted with the correction of 2019 (from 2018) International Conference as published in the Air News.

Treasurer's Report – Presented by M. Monaco. Reviewed proposed 2016-17 budget. 
HIGHLIGHTING OUR MEMBER
