ANOTHER SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY FOR STUDENT PILOTS

The Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship Fund First Wings Awards are semiannual awards of up to \$6,000 based on completion of specific training milestones. They are available to Student Pilot Members of The 99s who meet the eligibility requirements. To be eligible, applicants must hold a student pilot certificate, have been an official Student Pilot Member three months prior to the application deadline, have logged five hours in the six months prior to the application deadline and show financial need. The Spring 2022 First Wings deadline is April 1. Instructions/application are available on The 99s website.
