## **FLYING and FRIENDS**

Dear Chicago Area Chapter 99s,

We are now hopefully getting into Spring weather where we will be able to fly and drive to events and share our love of flying and aviation related activities. My objective as Chairman is to make sure that everyone that wants to get involved in the 99s and the chapter has the opportunity. Girls Scout Aviation Day. Ellen O'Hara has been the chair, and I'm setting up to co-chair this year, so that at some time if Ellen wants to turn it over to me (which may be several years in the future because she really loves doing it) then I am ready to take it over. We get lots of members involved, and we need to understand the stations so that newer members can start learning the process from the more experienced members.

Our Chapter website is currently run by Cynthia Madsen. Deena Schwartz has offered to help.

### **RUTH FRANT**7

Ruth Ellen Ellis Frantz passed away peacefully on Friday, March 30, 2018 at home in Huntley surrounded by her loving family.

Introduced to her husband Bob by his sister, Marilyn Frantz, her best friend at Northeast High School in Kansas City, Ruth was persuaded to go on a date that was a ride in Bob's small airplane. Thus began their adventure in life together that lasted over 65 years. Ruth married Robert Waldo Frantz in 1949, and they raised Margaret, Robert, Shirley and Randall in Roselle, Illinois after traveling the country in a trailer for Bob's job.

Ruth was employed for many years at Quaker Oats in Barrington, IL, but always made time to fly with Bob. After a his hiatus from flying, Bob took it up again and Ruth then became a pilot as well. They built a house in The Landings in Huntley in order to better access the sky. Ruth became a Ninety Nine in August of 1973 when she discovered the International Organization of Women Pilots, and she continued her membership and support until the end. She found many friends with us. She and Bob were also leaders in the Schaumburg Pilots Association, the Illinois Pilots Association and the



US Pilots Association. Ruth served our 99s Chicago Area Chapter and all of the other groups in many positions and volunteered in all areas.

In the most recent position of service to women pilots, Ruth served on the Santori Scholarship Committee, helping to choose which applicants would be helped in pursuing their aviation goals. She also served on the ByLaws review committee for our Chapter.

Ruth and her husband Bob flew together in almost every Midwest air derby, and they usually finished in trophy position. We have a lovely large silver cup that recognizes all of the winners of our Chapter Air Meet and Ruth's name has been engraved on it more than once. The Piper Arrow that they competed in was a seen as a threat to many who wanted to fly to win :-)

When a grandson was diagnosed with mental illness, Ruth found and led the whole family to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI). This showcased her passion for action on behalf of her family and others similarly affected.

Ruth was also active on the North Central Section level of the 99s, and served that body well. She will be missed in every area of her life and especially by her loving family and her dear 99s. God speed, Ruth, on your flight west.



A memorial service was held at DeFiore Jorgensen Funeral Home in Huntley on Saturday, April 8, 2018.

Many of her 99 friends visited her in the nursing home the week prior to her return home,
and many more were present to celebrate her life at the memorial service.

Hope to see you at the fun-filled events we have planned over the next few months!  $J\mathcal{U}$ 



### Flying Instructions

Primary & hard surface runway is 12/30. Grass runways are 09/27 & 17/35. Check NOTAMs for grass runway availability. If a lot of recent rain they may be closed. After landing get on hard surface taxiway that parallels runway 12/30 and proceed to taxiway FOXTROT. Go South (only way possible), and our hangar is the 3rd one on your left. Assuming ground is not too soft you can park on the grass in the yard immediately to the North of our hangar. You can also park on the grass immediately to the west of this area across taxiway Foxtrot. Parking is also available on the grass immediately to the South of our hangar. Now, if ground is too soft for some of the heavier planes (Bonanzas, etc.) parking is available on the 2nd ramp to your left as you come off the main taxiway, Erikson's ramp, the ramp immediately to the West of our hangar and the next two ramps to the South on the west side of taxiway Foxtrot. All a short walk to our hangar. In all cases make sure you are far enough off taxiway Foxtrot so planes can get by. If parking gets too congested just park on the main ramp east edge by the fuel pumps & office at the west end of the airport and call our cell phones; Gregg= 630-277-0989, Mary Lou= 847-340-2725 and we will send someone to pick you up.

### **Driving Instructions**

Our address is 2909 Howard St., Poplar Grove, IL. Easiest way for most will be to go west on I-90 (toll road) and get off at the Genoa Rd., Belvidere exit and go North. You will go through 5 stoplights, then come to a sweeping curve to the left. Continue, now Westbound, to Route 76. There will be a stoplight there & the Boone County Fairgrounds on the Northeast corner. Go North on Rt. 76 about 3 miles and you will see the Byron Bank on your right. Turn right on Waco Way at the bank. Now you are going East. Howard St. is the 4th street on your left. 2909 is almost at the end on the left. Park anywhere on the driveway, or on the street. Then walk around the house on the right, follow the blacktop drive to our hangar. We are planning a really nice event.
