

BUCKET LIST ADVENTURE CHECKED OFF!

This morning I drove out to Dacy Airport in Harvard, IL to attend a monthly meeting of the 99's. I'm a long time, proud member of the Chicago Area chapter. After our meeting we were graciously invited to take a ride in Tom Lowe's 1942 Stearman The Stearman is a vintage WWII, two seat, open cockpit, bi-plane, trainer aircraft, with fabric and wood construction upon a steel frame fuselage. This Army PT-13/-17, Navy NS/N2S was used to train thousands of military aviators in the 1930's and 1940's. Today, on this beautiful late summer day, I got to fly in Tom's beautiful Stearman!!! Looking like Snoopy, Tom handed me the bomber hat with goggles, buckled me in and we were off heading toward Dacy's grass strip runway. About 200 feet off the ground, one unprovoked tear dropped from my eye and thoughts of my Dad, Vyto, came to mind. My Dad inspired me to follow in his tracks and earn my own private pilot's license. Dad



inspired me not only to soar in the sky but to do so in life, on the ground, as well. Dad's 101st birthday would have been this coming Tuesday, September 18th. I get the feeling he had something to do with making today happen for me. Thanks for your birthday gift, Dad! Once up to about 1,500 feet, Tom allowed me about 15 minutes at the stick. I made some tight turns without losing any altitude . .indescribable joy! We spent about 30 minutes in the air. Upon landing, Tom complimented me on my maneuvering of his machine. Quite the compliment from this retired UAL captain. As a side note, the Chicagoland pilot community is such a tightly woven network that one pilot is only one or two degrees removed from another pilot friend. As it turns out, my former flight instructor, Bob Russo, co-piloted with Tom at UAL. When Bob captained the 737 for UAL, Tom's son co-piloted with him. Bob Russo ended up retiring from UAL, captaining UAL's final flight of the 737. To this day the Russo's remain my dear friends. Photos taken today with Tom and I, (shown on our Facebook page) include videos of our take-off and landing and finally a picture of my Dad, Vyto with his beloved Mooney, taken in 1973 at Midway airport in front of what today is the Southwest Airlines hangar. Today's excitement will not soon fade from my memory . . . Thank You Mr. Lowe!

HIGHLIGHTING OUR MEMBER

Inspired by her father Vyto, starting from Chicago's Midway airport, Linda finally earned her private pilot's license in the summer of 1975 in Michigan City, IN. During the following year at NIU, Linda was sponsored to become a 99 by Donna Bennett, wife of Dr. Jack Bennett, Biology professor and faculty sponsor of the NIU Flying Huskies. As NIU did not have an aviation program, the Flying Huskies received no financial support from the university. It was during this time that 99, Polly Gilkison learned of Linda and gratefully convinced the Chicago Area Chapter to sponsor her attendance at a local NIFA competition. For a time as President of the Flying Huskies, Linda alongside her mostly male members, washed and waxed resident airplanes at DeKalb and Rochelle airports as a means to earn money to support the club's flying activities. Imagine a dozen poor college kids, flying 3 new Cessna 172's (sometimes in light formation) with the monies they earned, to places like Kansas City, KS to tour the Cessna plant, La Crosse, WI to partake in Oktoberfest and Great America in Gurnee, IL to enjoy some summer school term, fun. During her college years, Linda worked as a bookkeeper at





B&W Aviation at Midway and later at MST Aviation in DeKalb where she was also responsible for answering the Unicom to deliver wind and active runway details. Solid aviation based friendships formed during those college years and greater dreams of flying prevailed at DeKalb airport that was then operated by 99, Tina Thomas' father-in-law.

After graduating from NIU with a double major in Accountancy and Finance along with a minor in Real Estate, the U.S. Air Force reached out to Linda with a military aviator career opportunity however lack of uncorrected 20/20 vision prevented her candidacy. Earning her CPA certification in 1984, Linda's focus turned to climbing the corporate ladder as a financial leader with such organizations as Coca-Cola, Navistar and recently as CFO for a Chicago non-profit.

The adage that "time flies" truly applies. It seems that just yesterday Linda enjoyed flights with her Dad in his beloved Chicago Midway based Mooney. But now Dad is long gone and so is the Mooney. As with many GA aviators, flying has just become such a costly love affair. Accustomed to paying \$14.50/\$17.50 per hour, wet, for a Cessna 152/172 just does not reconcile with today's rental pricing and once you've owned an airplane, it's hard to go back to renting. Linda now relies on her friends who own airplanes for a little occasional time at the stick. Though a pilot forever at heart, in absence of an airplane, Linda now otherwise just flies her broomstick . . . it's far more economical!

Though not a super active 99 over the years, Linda takes a great deal of pride in her long time membership and support of the organization. She attends local meetings when she can and has lent a hand at a couple recent Girl Scout Aviation Badge Day events. She is now taking on the 99's member badge order program from Rita Adams.
