

(they aren't allowing reservations there yet—but will seat us in there if we show up with a good group)

For advance planning—consider the Treehaven weekend in Wisconsin on September 23-26. If you have not attended a North Central Section Meeting, this location sure sounds like a good place to attend your first. It's a beautiful facility in the Stevens Point area with lots of outdoor activity. The registration forms are included in Waypoint—the Section newsletter that has been emailed to each of you. And I have also included them with this newsletter.

And in October our new Secretary Shelley Ventura will host a flying competition at her home airport—Campbell in Grays Lake. Stay tuned. Try to be as good as you were when you prepped for your Private checkride!

For our Chicago Chapter members only, we have included a copy of the budget put together by Donna Klein and Deena Schwartz and approved by the Board. We intend to ask for your vote of approval at our September 1st Business meeting.

But don't stop thinking about what we can achieve with the resources we have. We want to have you consider the best way for us to design and manage a Chapter scholarship. We have some ideas on sources of funding, and would like to do more for our members who need help to finance their dreams. One of the bigger problems is determining what exactly consititutes financial need. We will be talking about it in the near future. Please join in.

I must admit that I think I could live the rest of my life without another conference call or Zoom meeting, but I don't think I will be able to. So, although it is my preference to hold meetings in person, I will try to gauge the need for electronic attendance and provide the means if and when it becomes necessary. Our July 10th International Annual Business Meeting was held remotely, and the report on that is printed on page 7. The proposal to change our system to one member/one vote is an inclusive solution for our world wide membership of more than 6000 women. I will always prefer to attend our Conferences and Meeting in person—they have been educational, inspirational, and fun. But for those who can't, they should be able to vote on the business of the 99s.

Future Conferences are scheduled in Charleston, South Carolina in 2022 and then Amman, Jordan, in 2023 and a group is advocating for a future conference in Atchison, Kansas, where both Amelia Earhart's Birthplace Museum (owned by the 99s) and the International Forest of Friendship are located. You may not be aware of the tax consequences of participating in the business of the 99s, but as a 501 (c)3 organization our expenses on behalf of the 99s are tax deductible, including travel to and expenses at the International Conference. It can make a difference.

Hello Everyone,

The combined 2020/2021 Illinois Aviation Hall of Fame banquet will be held on October 7, 2021 at the Hilton Garden Inn in St. Charles, Illinois, near DuPage Airport.

Transportation will be available from DuPage airport, so if you plan to fly in please make specific arrangements with Tom Cleveland in advance.

The banquet room bar will open at 5PM and opening remarks/dinner will begin at 6PM. Tickets will be \$60.00 each.

Seating will be arranged 6 or 8 to a table depending on the status of the covid situation at the time we hold the banquet.

This year, we are using a registration form, where possible, to help keep track of our reservations and to keep sufficient contact information on people so that we can reach them if there are any changes in arrangements. The form is a "fillable" pdf – so you can fill in the fields save it and email it to us without needing to print and scan. It also has extra lines for the additional people in your party if you are signing up a group. As usual you may call in, email in or snail mail your reservation information to Tom Cleveland.

The hotel is offering us a nightly rate on a room block of \$97 plus taxes for the night of the banquet. The room block and the link to it are not up yet, that information will follow shortly when I have it.

Dinner is Chicken parmesan with soup, salad, dessert and drink with a vegetarian option of eggplant parmesan available.

The applications are due to your Chapter Amelia Earhart Scholarship Chair by October 1, 2021. You need to have joined the Ninety-Nines by July 1, 2021. 
