Called to order: 1836 by Chair.

New Business:

A motion was made and approved unanimously to use the \$100 Lucky Monk Gift Card at a future event at the Lucky Monk Restaurant.

A motion was made and approved unanimously to deposit to the chapter operating funds the \$882.92 received from the North Central Section from the Dayton excess proceeds.

Yanina to act as our Waypoint Reporter. She will work with Diane Cozzi for guidance on the process. Thank you Yanina Jill provided an update on our Girl Scout Day. Saturday May 9, 2020 at Lewis University, Romeoville, IL. The school will provide us classroom space for each station, hangar space and a 172 to conduct the pre-flight planning session. Six stations are planned. (after the meeting Colleen reached out to Jill to see if we can somehow incorporate the MD80 recently donated to Lewis by American Airlines.) Mona and Eva agreed to conduct pre-flight planning. Yanina agreed to conduct navigation. We plan for 100 girls ages 8-17 and stagger the sessions by age group. Minimum needed ??? Jill will reach out to Women in Aviation for additional volunteers, if needed. In turn, we will help with their event in Sept.

Shelley Ventura is hosting the March Event at Campbell Airport which will be a Spot Landing Competition. The airport has requested additional insurance which we will get from 99s International. Shelley will submit the request and the cost of \$125.00 will be approved at the March, 19th Business Meeting after appropriate notice of the expense has been provided to members. The event is opened to non-99s. \$5 per landing. Eva to reach out to friends in spotting group to take pictures.

There is an agreement on using the funds for scholarships for chapter members up to an amount of \$1,000 per recipient. Mona suggested that the funds be used for an additional certification – such as tail dragger, glider, A&P instead of a primary rating (PPL, CPL).
