He'd never been in a fully developed spin before, completely froze on the controls, and the DPE had to take control. Despite knowing the recovery procedure, there is nothing that can quite prepare you like the real thing.

Voting online, rather than requesting a paper ballot, can really lower the voting costs for your organization.

Make sure your contact information is up to date!

New in 2026! Voters who have chosen to vote online can now receive their ballot by both email AND text. Make sure that your member profile includes both a current email address AND a current phone number for a device that can receive text/SMS messages. You can access your ballot via the link in either the email or the text message, but you can only vote once. We are also looking at the possibility of sending voter notifications via WhatsApp. More to follow.
