A fundamental knowledge of arithmetic is absolutely indispensable to every person who would be able to carry out the ordinary transactions of daily living. (Example) Since such understanding is so basically necessary, arithmetic (counting and number concepts) is one of the first things a child is taught in school. It is therefore familiar to all both young and old.

Since it is such a vital part of our lives, it is small wonder that the Bible abounds in lessons couched in mathematical terms. Furthermore these Bible lessons are as easy to understand as

2+2=4.

Arithmetical problems fall generally into four classes: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Let us observe their use in the Bible. I. Addition. There is addition that should not be done, addition that only God can do and addition we must do.
