Why Rivers Are Crooked

Nature is often spoken of as God's other book. It is older than the Bible. It proclaims the Supreme Being - but it remains for the Bible to tell us who this is. Nature declares His Glory and power while the Bible reveals His goodness, mercy, condescension and love. Only lessons taught.

I Some lessons Nature teaches: 1. The testimony of the Bible.

2. There are many things in the natural world which remind us of the spiritual. Sun (Mal. 4:2); Star (Rev. 22:16); Rock (Ps. 89:26) Tree (Rev. 22:2); Grass (I Pet. 1:24); Lamb (Jno. 1:29); Leaven (I Cor. 5:7); Land (Heb. 6:7-8); Vines (Jno. 15:5-6) etc.

II We would like to take a lesson from Rivers.

1. Rivers form a prominent part of God's creation, and all men are more or less familiar with them. 2. One of the noticeable things about rivers is their serpentine course. No one has ever seen a river that was entirely straight form its beginning to end.

3. Why are rivers crooked? "a river becomes crooked by following the line of least resistance"

"So does man"

4. This will be valuable knowledge if we apply to ourselves. Are we as crooked as a river?

III Some things the Lord expects of His People: 1. To walk in straight (consistent And correct) paths. (Heb. 12;13). What it means. There are many things hindering such a course:

a. External: (Acts 14:22, I Thess. 3:3, I

Tim. 6:9-10)

b. Internal: (Jas. 1:13-14)

2. Must resist evil which would leave a crooked trail: (Jas. 4:7, Rom. 12:21, Song "yield not to temptation)

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V Some practical applications:

1. It is not beyond the power of people to know way which God has ordained for them. (Eph. 2:10, I Cor. 10:13, Jas. 1:2-8)

2. Christians should remember the word of the Lord when they are tempted to follow the line of least resistance.

a. By walking in worldly ways (Jno. 2:15-17, Jas. 4:4) No compromise.

b. By absenting selves from assembly of saints. (Heb. 10;24-26)

c. By seeking to recompense evil for evil (Rom. 12:19-21)

3. If they use strength God gives, no obstacle can turn them from the way of righteousness. (Phil. 4:13, Ps. 119:11, Mt. 4:4) (Ps. 119:105) The pathway leads straight up to heaven. The crooked rivers wandering down hill all the way, empty into the dark sea of everlasting regret.

a. Are you on a straight course, walking in strict accord with the will of the great King?

b. That straight course is blue printed in the N.T. and sealed with the blood of the Son of God.

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Matt. 24:32-33 "Now learn a parable of the fig tree; When his branch is yet tender, and putteth fath leaves, ye know that summer is nigh: So likewise ye, when ye shall se all these things, know that it is near, even at the doors."

Mt. 13:31-32 "Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field: Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown it becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof."
