We continue to have weekly roundtables with key Fayette County party members planning for the 2024 Convention Cycle, strategizing on the critical need to find good candidates for the upcoming 2024 County, State, and Federal Elections, and beating the bushes for the many volunteers and financial support needed to assure our candidates get elected.

### **Candidate Search**

We are searching for strong candidates like our recently elected candidates in PTC and Tyrone, candidates who put their constituents needs and desires above ego and personal gain, who question the narrative and listen to the voters, and who keep the FCRP informed about and seek input from our members regarding issues in Fayette County. # **Board of Education:**

With schools that don't have discipline, safety, and good curriculum, our students won't learn, and good teachers will flee to other counties or other professions. With poorly performing, woke schools our property values will take a hit. So far, we have only one committed new candidate for the Board of Education. She was the only observer at the last BOE meeting. Important decisions were made at that meeting with just one citizen observer. We must do better.

### **Fayette County Commission**

Three of the five members of the County Commission are up for election in 2024. We have 2 possible candidates, but we need more. Please look for candidates or consider running yourself.

### **Fayetteville City Council**

All of Fayette County is affected by what happens in Fayetteville. We share both its benefits and its problems. Are you pleased with the Fayetteville City Council's plans for building and traffic control? Do you know that they are planning to put 300 rental homes (600 to 1000 sq ft) on 22 acres off of Gingercake Road and Hwy 54? What will that do to traffic in our beautiful Fayette County? Would you want to live close to those 300 rental homes? Do you know that a number of liquor stores have been approved for Fayette County, some of them near homes? Do you believe that was the will of the majority of voters?

The FCRP ran a great candidate for the Fayetteville City Council in the 2023 election who unfortunately did not win her race. In a predominantly democrat municipality, it is hard for a Republican candidate to win and therefore doubly hard to find good people willing to run. You will have the chance to vote for new City Councilmen in 2025. We need to begin looking for more good candidates now.

### Volunteers

We need more volunteers to support our candidates and make sure Republican voters show up at the polls. We have both sedentary and active jobs. Please consider one or more of the following important tasks:

- <u>Staff the FCRP office</u> to assist citizens who need information or want to volunteer, distribute campaign literature and signs, help with small office tasks.
- Work as a poll watcher to observe at the polls for our upcoming elections.
- Work on election day at one of the many polling places in Fayette County
- <u>Assist with door knocking</u>, as a driver or to knock on doors. Door knocking is the most powerful and effective way to inform people about our great candidates and get them elected.
