



A Quick Note to Start


The best way to learn how to play Tri-Plex is from someone who knows how to play. If a teacher is not available to you, then this booklet will help you begin to understand the basic ideas of how to play Tri-Plex.

What is Tri-Plex?


Tri-Plex is simply 3 games of Tic Tac Toe, all played at once, on the same board, with movable pieces.




The Tower This is the Tower board. It is 3 Tic Tac Toe grids stacked on top of each other, creating a 3x3x3 playing area.




The Sets There are 2 sets of pieces. Each set has 4 types of pieces: Squares, Triangles, Circles and a Wild Piece.




The Pieces There are 3 of each shape & 1 Wild piece of both colors.



The Goal The goal is just as simple as that of Tic Tac Toe: to get 3 in a row. This is called an alignment.




The Catch All 3 alignments, 1 of each type of piece, must be made at the same time.







The Wild Piece may be played as any type of piece in any alignment.



The Wild Piece may also be played in multiple alignments at the same time.



The Tower Exception On the Tower board Diagonal alignments are <u>NOT</u> allowed.



Summary

In turns, players play any one of their pieces into any open space. Once all pieces have been played onto the board, they may then be moved from space to any open space. Even if a piece is already part of an alignment, it may be moved and that alignment may be broken (which is the major strategy of the game). Remember that the goal of the game, in the end, is to form all 3 alignments at the same time.

The Goal

To be the first player to form 1 alignment of all 3 types of pieces at the same time.

3 Rules

1. Players play any 1 of their own pieces into any open space.

- All pieces must be played onto the board before they may be re-positioned.
- Players may then move any
 1 of their own pieces from
 where they were played
 into any open space.

The Wild Piece May be played as any of the other 3 types of pieces in any alignment. -and-May be used in multiple alignments at the same time.

Alignments

Must be announced upon making and breaking. -and-May be broken in order to reposition them later in the game.

Etiquette

The last player to play all of their pieces onto the board is to then announce ALL IN.

You may spin the board, once ALL IN is announced, but only before (never after) you make your play.

A piece may not be played back into the same space from which it was moved on the previous play.
