About the Cover Art: You see this cosmic battle going on where it appears that the ancient serpent has Christ in his jaws to consume Him, see the cross, the fulfillment of that first Gospel from Genesis 3. Then you see His Church where He is in the center and drawing all manner of people unto Himself. This is the Gospel, Word and Sacrament in action. The crowds streaming into heaven and the Victorious Christ, the risen and ascended Christ upon His throne surrounded by all the faithful departed. Even as you see the throngs of hell assailing the Church but they cannot prevail. Is it scary, only for the unbelieving for them there is no escape. But for the faithful, it is the final deliverance from sin, death, devil and hell into the bliss of paradise with God.

The Lord's Prayer: Why does the pastor alone pray the Lord's Prayer during the Divine Service? In the Divine Service, the Lord's Prayer is a part of the Words of Christ and traditionally was even wrapped deeper within Eucharistic prayers as part of the Verba (The Lord's Words, the Words of Institution). Thus, as it is given only to those who serve by the command and in the stead of Christ to consecrate the elements at the Lord's altar, so to, it is given to them alone to pray that prayer in the Divine Service. In other orders of service, i.e. Matins, Vespers, Evening Prayer, etc. and during the Rite of Baptism, the entire congregation prayers the Lord's Prayer together. In these services the prayer is separated from the Verba by other pieces of the liturgy. Certainly there is no restriction on your praying the Lord's Prayer throughout your day. In fact, Luther encourages you to begin and end each day praying the Lord's prayer and confessing the Apostle's Creed.



The Holy Gospel:

Luke 21:25-36


After receiving the Sacrament

Chrismon Advent 2

Lk 21.25-36

Poinsettia star-shaped leaves call to mind Christ who calls Himself the "bright morning star." (Revelation 22:16-17)

Echoing the Lord's words from today's Gospel the pastor turns to us each Sunday and commands "Lift up your hearts" and we say: "We lift them up to the Lord." What we mean by this is that

we want to stop thinking about other stuff. However inattentive we've been to this point in the Service, whatever grudges we might have been holding, whatever lusts or fantasies we might have been indulging, let us forsake all sin now. Let us repent and come before the Lord's risen Body and Blood with awe and joy and thanksgiving. We lift our hearts up to the Lord where they belong, not high in heaven, but we lift them up to the Altar, not to be sacrificed, but we lift up them to the altar where He promises to be for us in order to receive the benefit and blessing of the One who Sacrificed Himself for us on the Holy Cross. We lift them up there, now, here, to receive Him as worthily as we might, that is with faith and confidence that His Word is true, that His invitation is valid and makes us worthy, and that He is here for us and truly forgives our sins.

This is your redemption, your Christ, who draws near. The one who died for you and has declared you righteous before His Father comes now in Word and Sacrament to bless you and encourage you. Soon He will also come in glory. He will finish the good work He has begun in you. Our joy now pales in comparison to the joy of that Holy Day. We, by grace, will lift up our heads and shout for joy at the Coming of the Lord in glory for even as His righteousness is our righteousness and His victory is our victory so also shall His glory be our glory.
