I live, and yet not I, but Christ lives in me. (Gal.2:20)

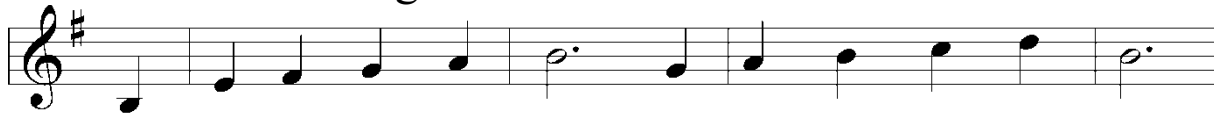

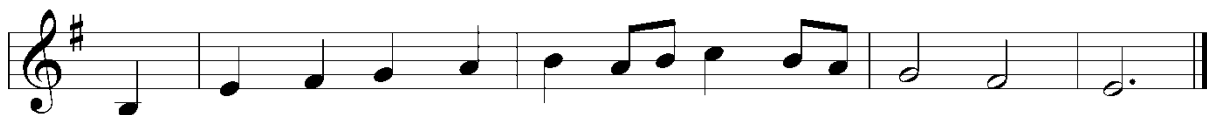
