Chrismon Corner

The Resurrection of our Lord – Easter Sunday Mark 16.1-8



Lamb with banner ***“For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed.”*** (1Corinthians 5:7 ESV). **Lamb of God (Agnus Dei):** This symbol emphasizes the sacrificial role of Christ. ***“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world”*** (John 1:29). ***“Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing”!***”

(Revelation 5:12). ***And Moses built an altar and called the name of it, The LORD Is My Banner.*** (Exodus 17:15 ESV)

A banner is something that identifies and unifies a particular group of people. For example, a military flag or standard is sometimes called a banner. The Israelites’ saying, “The Lord is my Banner,” was a way of identifying themselves as the unified followers of the Lord God. A banner also functions as a rallying point for troops in a battle. The altar Moses built in Exodus 17 marked the place where God intervened on behalf of His people and promised to utterly defeat His enemies. God’s people continue to say, “The Lord is my Banner,” because it is in His power that the enemies are vanquished. Christ crucified is our Banner in that He is the One under whom we unite. He is our Savior. We are rescued by Him and identified in Him.
