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NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Horton explained that the Engineer is here for Lost River if council has any questions. We do have the two maintenance bonds, but we cannot find where the inspection fees were paid. Mayor Horton stated that we do have a letter clearing the project and recommending the town accept ownership. Mayor Horton said we can go ahead and accept the resolution contingent that the inspection fees will be paid. Alderman Cathcart asked, how much are the inspection fees? Stephanie Collier said they are a little above \$12,000.00.

RESOLUTION 18 OF 2023

WHEREAS it is a function of the Town of Benton to operate and maintain public roads, drainage, and public water and sewer infrastructure; and

WHEREAS the construction of streets, drainage, water, and sewer infrastructure in Lost River North Unit 5 was monitored and inspected by Balar Engineers; and

WHEREAS Balar Engineers has submitted a letter stating that all work associated with the project has been completed in accordance with the drawings approved on August 24, 2022, and recommends acceptance of said infrastructure; and

WHEREAS the Board of Aldermen finds that it is in the best interest of the public to accept said streets, drainage, and public water and sewer infrastructure.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF BENTON, LOUISIANA:

- **§1.** No lots may be sold, and no building permits shall be issued until the 3% inspections fees have been paid and that the appropriate two (2) year maintenance bonds are received and appropriately filed with the Bossier Parish Clerk of Court by each respective Contractor prior to final acceptance.
- **§2.** This Resolution shall become effective upon final adoption and signature by the mayor.

Mayor Horton stated that Mr. Tim Chance is here to answer any questions council may have. Mr. Chance stated that he was sorry he was not present at the last meeting, and it had to be tabled. He went on to say that some changes have been made and the entire structure will be a warehouse. He stated that a large oil and gas company is moving their headquarters to Benton, and they have committed to leasing space in the new office buildings next to the Courthouse. He stated that they will need a warehouse to house their parts. Alderman Jones asked about if there will be no ise? He stated that the apartments are right next door. Mr. Chance stated that there will be no noise problem, that this company is using to store spare parts for when equipment must be repaired and there will be very little traffic to and from the facility. Alderman Cathcart asked about the hours of operation. Mr. Chance stated that there are really no hours of operation and that the company is a 24/7 business and that if they had an issue with equipment late at night, they would need to access the warehouse. Council members agreed. Carlotta stated that because this is going to be a warehouse only the required parking spaces are reduced to 1 space per 1000 sq ft.
