Example: Chat-GPT, LLaMA, PaLM






Midjourney

- Uses Discord.

Chat-GPT

- Started 2022.
- Chatbot
- LLM
- Uses your text-based prompts to generate text responses.
- At its core: fancy autocomplete



The Ethics Around AI Use! Ways this will crop up:

Do you make your own covers? Where did the component art pieces come from? Sites like pixabay are getting flooded with AI art. Stock image sites as well.

Do you hire someone to make your covers? How do you know if they are using AI?

Has Google or Amazon messaged you asking if you would like to try their AI voice talent?

Have you had the thought 'what if I just asked ChatGPT for the text of a kids book, then used Midjourney to make the art?'

The Ethics Around AI Use! Ways this will crop up:

The Ethics Around AI Use!

The Narrators Have Already Lost The War

- Audiobook narration has probably already lost the war to AI.
- There aren't nearly as many narrators as artists and authors.
- Al narration has applications in accessibility.
- It's only going to get better.

 The moment Amazon started rolling it out to authors was the moment it was over.

Al art can't be copyrighted.

Al hasn't been fully legally tested yet. There are lots of lawyers yet to get involved.




Most technological improvements have traditionally hurt blue collar workers (robotics for example). Al is the first on to really threaten white collar jobs.

Your interactions are used to train the AI. So, if you use it to generate content, like story ideas, that content is potentially used to answer other prompts.

 This is probably less of a concern than you are worried about, unless you are using AI to actually write your books.

TOR attempted to use AI in the cover for the book shown. People aware of it were furious.

Tor did not care though.


This cover won the Self-Published Fantasy Blog-Off (SPFBO) cover contest, which requires no AI be used. Spoiler: it used AI. The author didn't know the cover artist used it.

Mark Lawrence, who organizes the SPFBO has now canceled the cover contest as part of the SPFBO.

Unethical people are churning out AI generated foraging books. Beyond just being pirated content essentially, folks have found where some contain content which is factually incorrect, and in some cases actively harmful.

A company in Scotland advertised their Willy Wonka Interactive experience using ads generated by AI (Left). What they offered is pictured on the right. It went...not well.

Ethical Uses For AI As An Author!

- Using AI voices to read your works back to you for editing purposes..
- Using programs like MidJourney to generate character images to help you visualize them.
- Using programs like Chat-GPT to help you brainstorm ideas.
- You can use it to quickly summarize research articles.

- You could use it for transcribing recorded voice notes.
- Many of the more advanced editing software suits use AI now.

What Might The Future Look Like?

Authors will commonly be using AI to quickly churn up a series bible. Simply plug your books into a personal GPT, and you will be able to ask it questions like:

- What color hair does Frodo have?
- How old is Aragorn?

- What is the name of the mountain where Smaug lives?
- When was the battle at Horn's Deep?
- How can I integrate second breakfast more fully into my life?

What Might The Future Look Like?

On a corporate level that same concept will look like this:

Final Thoughts

The reality is that eventually AI will become settled law, and there will be ethically sourced AI to some degree. The landscape for creatives is going to change dramatically. It may one day be totally socially/morally acceptable to use AI to generate your book covers. So, you can't just stick your head in the sand and ignore it, hoping it will go away. It's here to stay. Pay attention.
