Bobby Hanna who has worked tirelessly on the technological side of things to improve our services. I appreciate you being patient with us as we are doing "on the job learning." It has been a blessing to me to hear from some of our members who share about what a blessing it has been to them to be able to watch the services.
- We were able to provide a brand-new resource for all our members. It is called "Right Now Media". It has been referred to as the "*Netflix*" of Christian bible studies with over 20,000 video bible studies available for you to watch.
