EXODUS 33: 13-15

Now therefore, I pray, if I have found grace in Your sight, show me now Your way, that I may know You and that I may find grace in Your sight.

And consider that this nation is Your people.”

Then he said to Him,

“If Your Presence does not go with us, do not bring us up from here.”

2 CORINTHIANS 3: 12-16

“Therefore, since we have such hope, *we use great boldness of speech*— unlike Moses, who put a veil over his face so that the children of Israel could not look steadily at the end of what was passing away. But their minds were blinded. For until this day the same veil remains unlifted in the reading of the Old Testament, because ***the veil is taken away in Christ.***

But even to this day, when Moses is read, a veil lies on their heart. Nevertheless ***when one turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away.***”

ACTS 1:11

“who also said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? ***This same Jesus***, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven.”

“¹⁴ And He said, ‘My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest.’ ¹⁵ Then he said to Him, ‘If Your Presence does not go with us, do not bring us up from here. ¹⁶ For how then will it be known that Your people and I have found grace in Your sight, except You go with us? So we shall be separate, Your people and I, from all the people who are upon the face of the earth.” (Exodus 33:14-16, NKJV).

As we journey in these 7-Days of prayer and fasting in preparation for our International Youth and Young Adult conference in San Antonio, it is very important for every one of us to understand the power of God’s presence. Scanning through the scriptures, one of the Bible characters that is duly authorized in words and deeds to help us understand and appreciate the power in God’s presence is *Moses*. In examining the credentials of *Moses* on the subject of the power in God’s presence, the Bible tells us that, **“He made known His ways to Moses, His acts to the children of Israel”** (Psalm 103:7); and **“So the Lord spoke to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend”** (Exodus 33:11a); and the LORD Himself put His seal of approval on it when He said, **“⁶ Hear now My words: If there is a prophet among you, I, the Lord, make Myself known to him in a vision; I speak to him in a dream. ⁷ Not so with My servant Moses; he is faithful in all My house. ⁸ I speak with him face to face, even plainly, and not in dark sayings; and he sees the form of the Lord. Why then were you not afraid to speak against My servant Moses?”** (Number 12:6-8). These scriptures are proof that *Moses* understood the power in the presence of God and he is a credible witness of what His presence can do for us individually and collectively.

Among the many benefits of experiencing the power in God’s presence, we will consider the testimony of *Moses* in our scriptural text, Exodus 33:14-16; and his personal experience when he stood in God’s presence for 40 days and nights without food and water, but he was sustained by the power of God. Science has proven that it is impossible for the human body to survive without both food and water over a long period of time. That report is true until you add *“The God’s Factor”*!

The Bible tells us specifically about Moses: ***“So he was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights; he neither ate bread nor drank water. And He wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the Ten Commandments” (Exodus 34:28)***. What was the outcome of Moses spending quality time in God’s presence? He came down from Mount Sinai with a glow and glory that was too powerful for any of the children of Israel to gaze upon, so they pleaded with Moses to put a veil over his face (Exodus 34:29-35). As powerful as that experience was, Apostle Paul tells us that it cannot be compared to the glory we enjoy every time we look unto Jesus - ***“⁷ But if the ministry of death, written and engraved on stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not look steadily at the face of Moses because of the glory of his countenance, which glory was passing away, ⁸ how will the ministry of the Spirit not be more glorious? ⁹ For if the ministry of condemnation had glory, the ministry of righteousness exceeds much more in glory. ¹⁰ For even what was made glorious had no glory in this respect, because of the glory that excels. ¹¹ For if what is passing away was glorious, what remains is much more glorious” (2 Corinthians 3:7-11)***. Our prayer and fasting is not just a ritual or a biennial exercise; it is a call for us to have an encounter with God and be transformed into His very image. While Moses only carried the glory on his face, we are actually transformed into God’s own image as we spend quality time in His presence according to 2 Corinthians 3:18, ***“But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.”*** Therefore, make sure you spend time with God in this season of prayer and fasting so that you can come to the conference with a vessel that is already saturated with the glory of God and prepared to receive all that God has for you.

In addition, Moses also helps us to understand that the presence of God brings a clear distinction between His people and others when he said, ***“¹⁵ If Your Presence does not go with us, do not bring us up from here. ¹⁶ For how then will it be known that Your people and I have found grace in Your sight, except You go with us? So we shall be separate, Your people and I, from all the people who are upon the face of the earth” (Exodus 33:15-16)***. The presence of God confirms His grace and power in the lives of His people, and brings a separation between His children and people of the world.



The presence of God destroys the stronghold of depression and releases the fullness of His joy into the lives of His children: ***“You will show me the path of life; in Your presence is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore” (Psalm 16:11).*** Therefore, as we fast and pray in preparation for the forthcoming conference, you must prepare your heart to experience God in a way that will change your life forever. *You must not allow your fast to be wasted.* It is not a time to sleep your time away or watch the television till your vision for the conference is destroyed. The future is bright and you must be intentional about getting there. Every word of prophecy over your life demands that you fight for it. No great destiny comes cheap; and anyone that wants to enjoy a great tomorrow must put up a good fight today. Jude told us to ***“contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints” (Jude 1:3).***

Likewise, the LORD gave us the secret to securing every good thing He has for us in the Book of Jeremiah 29:10-13. In verses 10-11, the LORD told His people of the great things He had for them in the future despite the captivity they were about to go into: ¹⁰ ***“For thus says the Lord: After seventy years are completed at Babylon, I will visit you and perform My good word toward you, and cause you to return to this place.”*** ¹¹ ***“For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.”*** But in the next two verses, the LORD revealed to the people what they have to do for the ***“good thoughts of His heart”*** to become a ***“reality”*** in their lives. The LORD said, ¹² ***“Then you will call upon Me and go and pray to Me, and I will listen to you.”*** ¹³ ***“And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart.”*** Eventually, when Daniel understood from the books that their seventy years in captivity were about to be over (Daniel 9:2), what did he do? The scripture says, ***“Then I set my face toward the Lord God to make request by prayer and supplications, with fasting, sackcloth, and ashes” (Daniel 9:3).*** Yes, that was what it took to secure the promise of their release from bondage. Daniel prayed and fasted. Though the enemy does not want to let go of his captives easily, but with prayer and fasting, just like Daniel, we shall surely overcome.



The persistence of Daniel paid off at the end when God sent His angels to secure Daniel's answers to his prayers according to Daniel 10:12-13, ¹² *Then he said to me, 'Do not fear, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart to understand, and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard; and I have come because of your words. ¹³ But the prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days; and behold, Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, for I had been left alone there with the kings of Persia' "* (Daniel 10:12-13).

So, **get ready for a shift in the atmosphere** as we believe God for an uncommon manifestation of His presence in these 7-days of prayer and fasting. **God has something unbelievably great in store for everyone that will be in attendance at this conference, but you must fight for your portion. Are you ready?**

FASTING WITH GOD

Fasting existed from the Old Testament to the New Testament. Throughout the Bible, we see a pattern of men and women practicing it—from Esther to Moses, Elijah, Daniel, Anna, and even Jesus Himself.

Jesus teaches, “...when you fast...” (*Matt 6:16*). Notice what He didn’t say: “if.” He said “when.” Jesus already concludes that we would fast—fasting is embedded in our nature.

Think about it: if you sleep 8 hours a day, that’s a third of your life. If a person lives to around 75, that means roughly 25 years spent asleep. And while you sleep, your body takes a break from food—hence the term “breakfast.” So your body already knows how to fast; it does it every single night. The question is no longer can you fast—it’s whether you’ll bring that same surrender into the daylight, on purpose, before God.

THINGS TO UNDERSTAND

- ➔ “Fasting changes us, it doesn’t change God
- ➔ “Fasting does not move God. It sensitizes your spiritual senses to be more in tune with God.”
- ➔ Fasting is not a hunger strike - being too busy/sleeping to not eat
- ➔ Fasting is abstaining from every pleasurable thing and focusing on God - it is not dieting
- ➔ Fasting should not be done as a religious exercise but as an essential ingredient in which we approach God in humility and dedication

BENEFITS OF FASTING

- Sensitizes our spirits to God
- Causes us to focus on God
- Produces spiritual capacity

BENEFITS OF FASTING

- Creates a hunger for God
- Clears you up emotionally by silencing your heart to hear the voice of God
- Has fantastic benefits for health and eradication of diseases
- Helps you lose unnecessary and unhealthy weight
- Saves money as large amounts of income are used on food
- In a fast we can expect ridiculous miracles from God.

TYPES OF FAST

ABSOLUTE FAST

The absolute fast is a fast in which one abstains from all solid and liquid foods. This fast typically permits only water with the option of light juices
(If you are considering this fast make sure you have no demanding physical work, educate yourself, consult your physician if you are taking medication, and consult God the ultimate physician)

PARTIAL FAST

The partial fast calls for you to abstain from eating between a period of time. For example fasting from 6am - 6pm, water only or fasting from 12am to 6pm, water only

(if you are considering this fast do not break your fast with a heavy meal, eliminate some of your favorite foods (food you enjoy,crave,or overeat)

SOUL FAST

If you've never fasted before, the soul fast is intended to help you focus on one aspect of your life that seems out of balance. For example, you may opt not to use social media during the fast, and then gradually bring those items into your life in moderation afterwards.

Consider doing a partial fast in addition to this one, fasting from 6 a.m. to 3 p.m.

DAY 1
WELCOME

DEVOTIONAL

God has a track record of meeting people. Think of Moses at the burning bush, the Samaritan woman at the well, or Jesus' encounters with His disciples on the road and by the shore. Across every page of Scripture, God shows up. He doesn't show up from a distance, but in the middle of ordinary life. Every time He shows up, **He's not just visiting. He's welcoming.**

He went out of His way to meet the Samaritan woman. The Bible doesn't say He happened to pass through Samaria, it says, "He needed to go through Samaria" (John 4:4). It was intentional. He rearranged His path for one encounter. That's how deep His desire to meet us runs. God's pursuit of us reveals His character of love. And the kindness of God is the expression of that love in motion. It heals wounds, reconciles relationships, and brings hope to the hopeless. His kindness doesn't just comfort us, it transforms us. (Psalms 36:7)

Throughout Scripture, He calls out: "Come to the waters" (Isaiah 55:1) "Come, all who are heavy laden" (Matthew 11:28) "Come and see" (John 1:39). **Not because we called to Him first — He calls to us first** (John 6:44). God initiates the meeting, and He takes great pleasure in seeing us come; He welcomes us. It was the memory of his father's house that finally turned the lost son around and brought him home (Luke 15:17-20). **One remembrance was enough to change the direction of his life.** Now, it's your turn.






This same God who pursued Moses, who pursued the woman at the well, who pursued the lost son — **He is pursuing you again.** This time, the meeting place is San Antonio. **This Same Jesus isn't just a theme, it's a continuation of the story that He's been writing from the beginning** — the God who goes out of His way, who calls before we ever call back, who turns hearts toward home. He is calling His people again, to come, to gather, and to encounter Him face to face.

So, if you're reading this, know that **this is the set time** — not only to gather with one another, but with God Himself. The meeting is at His house, and that house is wherever we make room for Him (John 15:4). Beloved, **it's your turn!** Come to the waters; don't worry about money, trust Him and have faith. Lay your burdens down at this altar, His arms are wide open. Come and see what He has for you, don't get distracted, **RUN!** He's been waiting to meet you here (Revelation 3:20).

Welcome into His presence. Now, **let's pray!**

DAY 2
WORSHIP**DEVOTIONAL**






Yesterday we learned about how Jesus went out of His way to meet the Samaritan woman. After realizing who He was, the conversation shifted to discussing about worship. **When one encounters God, your response is worship.** You worship Him for who He is, what He has done, and knowing there's much more He has in store to do for and with you. Worship is the way we express gratitude and our love for Him. (Hebrew 12:28)

Our anchor text tells us how God wants to be worshiped; **in spirit and truth.** To truly worship God calls for all of you; body, spirit and soul. You can't say you're truly worshipping God if you're distracted, not authentic or weighted down by worries of life. He said "*Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.*" (Matthew 11:28) Until you trust Him with your load, only then can your worship be accepted. The Samaritan woman started the conversation about worship by stating what she was taught about where to worship, her truth. However, Jesus revealed that **location doesn't matter, it's a matter of your heart posture.** To have the right heart posture, you must be honest and authentic with Him. Being honest about your shortcomings and **worshipping Him not because you want something, but because you honor and revere Him.** Your revelation of who God is to you determines whether you will worship Him in spirit and truth. How do you see Him? Is He Your Father? Your maker? Your Restorer? Even if you haven't encountered Him in a particular way, knowing He is able to fulfill that role should provoke you to worship Him as that until it becomes your experience. For example, if you are trusting Him for healing, you can worship Him as your healer knowing He is able and will heal you at His time.

Worship is the key in God's kingdom. The Psalmist tells us to enter His presence with thanksgiving and with praise (Psalm 100:4). Among all the instructions and mandate God has given us, worshipping Him is **top priority** (Ps 150:6). Jesus exemplified how important worship is, and being heirs of His kingdom, we are to follow in His footsteps (Matthew 4:10; Matthew 11:25; John 11:41 & 1 Peter 2:21). So, brothers and sisters, THIS SAME JESUS is waiting for you to worship Him in spirit and truth in this conference. Are you going to give it to Him? **Let's pray!**

DAY 3
WASH

DEVOTIONAL

In John 13, Jesus knelt before His disciples, basin in hand, washing their feet—a picture of servanthood. But when He came to Peter, Peter pulled back, unable to bear his Lord stooping so low to him. Yet something shifted, and he found himself longing to receive what Jesus offered. This wasn't merely about the consequence of refusing to be washed. The phrase "no part" (John 13:8) is a Hebraic expression tied to inheritance. Jesus wasn't performing a ritual; He was unveiling a truth: this washing keeps us aligned with Him, and it's how we receive all He has for us—a washing only He can do, **in His presence, with us.**

This is the posture we're called into as we gather for this conference. Before an encounter, before an impartation, there must be a washing. We come not to add another experience, but to be **undone, aligned, and made ready.**

It's in His presence that we see how far we've wandered. Even David didn't come to this place alone—not until "the LORD sent Nathan to David", exposing a wrong that was never just against man, but against God Himself (2 Samuel 12:1b). Then, David finally felt the ache to be washed. This is the posture repentance asks of us (Deuteronomy 29:20 & Isaiah 2:9).

Consider this a moment to reason with God. There once was an angel of God filled with beauty and perfection, given free will just as we are. His name is Satan. God did not create this evil; Satan chose, of his own will, to rebel against God.

There's a hymn we've sung so often: ***Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb?*** Notice—it's a question, not a statement. One this conference will ask of every heart in the room.

So today, a choice is set before you: "*If you are willing and obedient, you shall eat the good of the land*" (Isaiah 1:19), or "*if you refuse and rebel, you shall be devoured by the sword; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken*" (Isaiah 1:20). The choice, and its consequence, is yours to carry. Now, **let's pray.**

DAY 4
WITHDRAWN

DEVOTIONAL

In this time of preparation, and as Christians, one thing we all should be exercising is the art of withdrawal. This “withdrawing” is the **intentional act of setting ourselves apart for prayer**. This is required in order to develop intimacy with God and to dwell in the secret place. This is why the Lord instructed His followers to *“go to your room... shut your door, [and] pray to your Father who is in the secret place”* (Matthew 6:6). We can see Jesus employ this strategy multiple times throughout His ministry. He was demonstrating to us the format on how to prepare for anything that may come our way, including the work of God. Also, it was how He recuperated spiritually when the work was done. In Luke 5, the scripture highlights that Jesus withdrew to pray after two events occurred: one where he calls Simon, Andrew, James, and John to follow Him after He had turned their fruitless overnight labor to a net-breaking miracle; and two, where He cleanses the leper causing the multitudes to begin to hear about Him. The fact that the scripture includes that Jesus withdrew to pray after these events shows us that **any ministry must be fueled by prayer**.

In addition, withdrawal is vital in accessing the presence of God. It helps counteract the effects that distractions can have on a person. When you separate yourself from others to go and meet with God, it makes it hard for the enemy to use distraction to pull your attention from Him. **The reason why the enemy uses distraction is because if he can take one’s mind off the things of God, he can make that person miss what God wants to do with him or her.** This is why the Apostle Peter says, *“Be sober, be vigilant, because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour”* (1 Peter 5:8). The way to be sober and vigilant is to spend time in prayer. When you commune with God, you won’t be thrown off by anything that may come your way. Again, we see this with Mary and Martha. Mary wanted to spend time learning at the feet of Jesus, while Martha was busy trying to serve. The Bible says, *“And Jesus answered and said to her, “Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things”* (Luke 10:41).

Distraction doesn’t only come in the form of other men, but also can be **the “many things”** Jesus was telling Martha about. When you withdraw, **put away your phone, take your mind off every worry**, the project you still have to finish, or that thing you have to buy later. Let your focus be on Him alone, and He will overshadow you with the glory of His presence. **Let’s Pray!**

DEVOTIONAL





Beloved, there are many things that God wants to do in this year's conference, but in order for those things to become realities in our lives, how we approach this conference matters. Are you approaching this year's conference with **thirst and hunger** or just as another biennial summer gathering? You cannot afford to come casually before God this year! Be intentional about your coming this year! The Psalmist says, *"As the deer pants for the water brooks, so pants my soul for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God?"* (Psalm 42:1-2). Without a genuine hunger for God, waiting on Him will be a strange concept to you.

Waiting on the Lord is about coming before Him with an **intentional heart posture of faith and expectation**. The Bible says, *"But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him"* (Hebrews 11:6). The truth is, God is the One who fulfills the desires of our hearts, and as you can see in the focal verse above, He gives divine strength when we come before Him with the right heart posture (Psalm 34:7 & Proverbs 23:18). The Bible says, *"They go from strength to strength; each one appears before God in Zion"* (Psalm 84:7). **The strength that God supplies when we wait on Him can manifest in diverse ways.** It's possible that you are coming to this conference struggling or trusting God for more capacity spiritually. The good news is, if you come with a heart posture that is truly seeking divine intervention, you will leave this conference strengthened and equipped by the help of the Holy Spirit to take flight in your spiritual life. It's also possible that you are coming to this conference with certain burdens or limitations. Don't give up! The LORD declared to Prophet Jeremiah, *"Behold, I am the Lord, the God of all flesh. Is there anything too hard for Me?"* (Jeremiah 32:27). **Come with a heart that is thirsty and centered on the Lord.** Make every day of this conference a day with Him truthfully, and watch the Lord strengthen you and give you the needed capacity to overcome every limitation.

The word of God says, *"They looked to Him and were radiant, and their faces were not ashamed"* (Psalm 34:5). Beloved, I hope you are excited about this year's conference. This SAME JESUS is still in the business of meeting the expectations of those who wait on Him in Spirit and truth. He is ever faithful! So, come before the Lord with intentionality in this conference, so that you may enjoy **times of refreshing** before Him (Acts 3:20). **DAY 6

DEVOTIONAL

Do you know the songs "My worship is my weapon, this is how I win my battles" or "Judah, Judah, Judah ehheh"? Yes, Minister Dunsin Oyekan is the leader of all of them, but these and many other sounds have a significant pattern. The winning strategy for warfare is through intercession and prophetic praise. "Judah" is a name that means praise. As a result, the phrase "Let Judah go first" means "Let Praise go first." In 2 Chronicles 20:15-22, King Jehoshaphat recognized this special tactic of sending the praise leaders ahead while the soldiers followed suit. The Lord established the people of Judah's victory as a result of this strategy. This tactic is also demonstrated in Joshua chapter 6 with the walls of Jericho. The type of praise given to the Lord defines the victory in our Christian walk. It was a strategy for confusing the adversary. Fear is therefore the natural emotion, but those who were on the Lord's side were given the insight that praise should come before them.

Let's examine David, a great "WARSHIP" leader. His constant time in God's presence, singing praise songs and praying to Him was a key component of his winning approach. Everyone should want to live in Jesus' presence, glorify Him, sing praise songs, and be in constant touch with Him through the place of prayer before, during, and after this conference. By the end of this conference, prayer altars will be rekindled, and the time spent praising the Lord in prayer will be seen as a tremendous honor rather than a job.

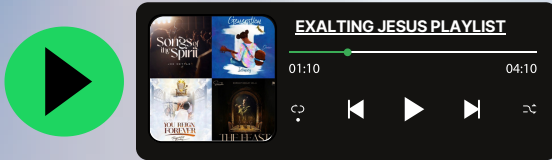
Think of every event like this as a training ground. See the prayer and the worship sessions as times when the Lord is preparing you in His presence to be that prayer warrior and to be that vessel that, upon returning home to your assembly at the end of this conference, sings God's praises ceaselessly. The Lord has given you the tools of prayer and praise, and you will use these tactics to fight for and gather everything that has been ordained for you at this meeting.

Now that God has completed His work, it is time for us to enter His courts with praise and His gates with gratitude! This same Jesus, who goes about doing wonders, is prepared to meet you where you are, fulfill your petitions, deliver, restore, and refine you, but prayer and praise are the vehicles that will get you there. I think about Paul and Silas in the book of Acts 16:25-34. **They did not wait till the chains were off their feet to praise.** Even in the midst of being bound, they prayed and sang (praised), and it resulted in their release from prison. What does this mean for you and I? **You don't have to wait till San Antonio, to pray and praise, give Praise right now! Pray right now!**

DAY 7

WEILDING THE WORD

DEVOTIONAL

One of the greatest privileges we have as believers is the authority to wield the Word of God. Every believer who understands their identity in Christ and the power of God's Word has been given the right to speak in faith and see God's purposes established. The psalmist declares, "For You have magnified Your word above all Your name" (Psalm 138:2). Take a moment to reflect on this profound truth: Why has God exalted His Word above His name? It reveals His unwavering commitment to fulfill every promise He has made. God is faithful to His Word and never fails to accomplish what He has spoken. The Bible further confirms this truth by saying, "For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God through us" (2 Corinthians 1:20b).

The authority to declare God's Word is exercised most effectively by believers who have a revelation of their sonship in Christ and understand the power God has given them to declare and decree His will on earth (John 1:12). This authority is demonstrated throughout the Scripture. From the very beginning, God revealed the creative power of His Word. In Genesis, He spoke the heavens, the earth, and everything within them into existence. Likewise, our Lord Jesus Christ demonstrated the authority of God's Word throughout His earthly ministry. When Satan tempted Him in the wilderness, Jesus overcame every temptation by declaring, "It is written" (Matthew 4:4; 7-10). Rather than relying on human reasoning, He stood firmly on the written Word of God.

Brethren, effective prophetic prayer requires a heart that is filled with God's Word. Your "word bank" must be rich with Scripture. You must know what God has said so that you can pray His promises with confidence and accuracy. Prophetic prayer is not based on personal opinions or emotions; it is the proclamation of God's Word against every scheme of the enemy. As we declare His promises, we align ourselves with His will and release His truth over our lives, families, ministries, careers, and every circumstance. However, we must remember that prophetic prayer is not a tool for pursuing selfish ambitions. Our requests must be consistent with God's will and aimed at advancing His Kingdom (Matthew 6:9-10).

PRAYERS

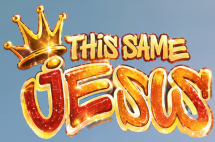
