This plant list was developed to assist residents in landscaping their properties. Grande Pointe landscaping guidelines call for a natural theme using a minimum of 50% native plants in arrangements that reinforce naturalistic settings and complement surrounding landscapes and common areas. Plants visible from the street should be native or otherwise on this list.

While any native plant may be used, this a list of the most widely used native plants available at local nurseries. The non-native plants were chosen because they are used throughout the neighborhood and perform well in our growing conditions. All plants on the list are for our cold hardiness zone of 9a and do well in our growing conditions. The University of Florida has a 'Florida Friendly Landscaping Program' (ffl.ifas.ufl.edu) with a great 'plant app' and 'Guide to Plant Selection and Landscape Design' that provides information on plants and tips for landscape design.

Any appreciable change to your landscaping must be submitted to the ARC for review and approval. Existing native plants are to be preserved and removed only when necessary and with ARC approval.
