Remembering our Friend, Neighbor & LFEHOA President, Wayne Anderson



On January 6, 2023, Wayne Anderson asked his good friend and neighbor, Bernie Glaze for a ride to the hospital to get his lungs checked as he was experiencing breathing difficulties. Who would have imagined that a little more than 24 hours Wayne would be leaving this earth as a result of blood clots from the legs traveling to both lungs. The shock and sadness have been felt by many. Wayne dedicated many years of his life to the Lake Forest Estates Community. Being a retired engineer benefited all of us.

On December 16, 2022 the LFEHOA Board, on behalf of our community, recognized Wayne with a plaque for his 10 years of outstanding commitment, dedication, and strong leadership to Lake Forest Estates. The presentation was made during "Fire Engine Event with Santa" and therefore many homeowners present had the opportunity to say, "Thank You" to Wayne. It was a surprise presentation and Wayne was touched by everyone's kind words of appreciation.

One of the evening speakers, Bernie Glaze, began his presentation only to be cut short as a result of Santa leaving and the Fire Engine music overpowering all conversations & presentations.

This next article is from Bernie Glaze, finishing his presentation now tribute, to his good friend Wayne Anderson.

Wayne Anderson, A Leader, A Neighbor, A Friend

Wayne M. Anderson was a Lake Forest Estates homeowner since 1993. As a young man, Wayne wanted to be a pilot. He never realized that dream, but when his nephew flew the A-10 Thunderbolt II for the US Air Force, Wayne lived vicariously through Stephen's experiences. Wayne often spoke with pride about his nephew's achievements and displayed mementos of Stephen's service to our country.

When I first met Wayne, his constant companion was a Boxer named Merlin. After Merlin passed away, Wayne adopted a Foxhound, whom he named Oliver. The story is that Oliver was born on July 4th and Wayne liked the movie "Born on the Fourth of July", so he named his new pal after the movie's director, Oliver Stone.

Wayne was very proud of the fact that he was a Professional Engineer and worked for the Weyerhaeuser Company for many years. An avid photographer, Wayne showed me pictures of his travels to exotic places, such as the Galapagos Islands and the Arctic Circle.

Wayne was also a local history buff. He attended seminars and collected books and other documents about the origin of towns in this area, some of which no longer exist. He told me about a railroad that carried coal from Black Diamond to Tacoma, which established a stop along the way that became Maple Valley.

Wayne and I attended an options trading class together. I drove Wayne down to Fife to pick up his new BMW.

In 2004, Wayne became the Contract Administrator for the Lake Forest Estates Homeowners Association. Later, he became Vice President of the HOA and then served as HOA President for 10 years from 2013 to 2022. As President, Wayne was an advocate for our neighborhood regarding the State Route 169 widening project and development of the Legacy Site. Wayne became the heart and soul of Lake Forest Estates, devoting his life to serving this community. Always willing to help others and do things to improve our quality of life, he taught us through his example how neighbors should behave toward one another.

One thing that will always remind me of Wayne is the Christmas lights at the entrance to our neighborhood. Each year, Wayne would organize a group of neighbors who volunteered to string the lights. Once up, he would keep them in working order. It seemed apropos to me that when Wayne passed away, the lights went out. More than just an HOA President though, Wayne was a presence in the community. He was always there to organize or lend a helping hand on a project or offer an attentive ear to a complaint. Wayne was a good neighbor. He was my friend, and I miss him.
