LFEHOA Financials - Dues Notification

During our LFEHOA Annual Meeting, homeowners approved 5.6% dues increase for CY 2025. This resulted in dues in- creasing from \$852 to \$900. This \$48 increase will cover inflation and ensure that we continue to fund Reserve Study Assets. HOA Dues notices will be mailed out to homeowners in January. Payment is due by February 28, 2025.

Dog Etiquette in the Park

As we embrace the winter season, the LFEHOA Board of Directors has been asked by several members of the community to address our community park usage, particularly regarding our four-legged friends.

During the past two months, we have received a number of complaints of off-leash dogs causing a nuisance to our Association members while using the park. We kindly ask all residents to exercise consideration and respect for each other when enjoying our shared space.


To protect the right of all homeowners to enjoy the use of the common area, including those with dog phobia and little kids, the Lake Forest Estates Board of Directors is investigating amending the park rules to require all dog owners to leash their pets when others are present in the park. This simple act ensures the whole community is safe, comfortable, and able to enjoy the use of our beautiful common area.

We recognize that some residents use the park for short periods to exercise their dogs offleash. Before allowing a dog to be off leash in the park please first verify no one else is using the park, including checking the beach area, and promptly leashing the dog if another Association member enters the park. If allowing your dog to be off leash while using the park, please pay extra attention to promptly cleaning up after your dog and keeping your dog off bushes and plants that the community works so hard to maintain.

In addition to our park rules, King County regulations, which are adopted into Maple Valley City Code, require all dogs "at large" to be "under control" at all times. "At large" means any animal off the premises of its owner and not under control of a competent person. (Ord. 19638 § 10, 2023). "Under control" means a domesticated animal is restrained, by a human using a leash or competent and effective voice or signal control, from approaching any bystander or other domesticated animal and from causing property damage. (Ord. 19638 § 39, 2023). For a dog to be at large and not under control is a public nuisance under King County Animal Control Regulations and Maple Valley City code.

Let's approach our park usage with humility and mindfulness of our neighbors' needs. By sharing the space respectfully and being considerate of each other, we can ensure that Lake Forest Estates remains a welcoming community for all.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding. Together, we can make our community park a joyful place for everyone to enjoy this winter season and beyond.
