#I Predictor of Social Mobility

- More time spent with individuals of higher socioeconomic status (SES) increases your probability of social mobility
- 20% average increase in adult income when child is raised with higher EC than their similar SES counterparts / peers

FRIENDING | BIAS

The tendency for individuals with low SES to gravitate towards others from similar backgrounds

- "It's not just about exposure [or] a diverse Harvard class. It's about actually getting people to interact. In college, you're much more likely to spend time with people who are more like you than people from a different socioeconomic status." - Raj Chetty, William A. Ackman Professor of Public Economics
