Pastor Mike Beezley: Championing Local Pastors and Associated Members

Pastor Mike Beezley assumes the role of Chair for the Fellowship of Local Pastors and Associated Members with enthusiasm and a deep sense of responsibility. With a background as a local pastor since 2007, Mike is aware of the unique challenges faced by this large clergy group. "I am representing the largest clergy group, with perhaps the smallest voice," he noted. Mike succeeds Rev. Pete Ward, whose leadership and guidance have been instrumental in easing his transition into this new role. Mike looks forward to advocating for the needs of local pastors and making their voices heard.
