For the month of November, we are collecting monetary and food donations for our Outreach Program

In December, we again will be distributing gift cards to those in need. A monetary donation to the Outreach Program in November will aid in the gift cards as well as our donations in the new year.

We also have a matching opportunity of \$5,000 from the Endowment Fund with what we receive in donations in November.

Another opportunity to support our friends in need is through a food collection.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture sent a letter informing states that there were insufficient funds to pay full SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits for November if the government shutdown continued. We are especially looking for donations that have long shelf lives, such as rice, dry noodles, jarred sauce, peanut butter, canned soup etc.

Each Sunday in November will be a collection opportunity. Bring any food items to church and place them on the table that will be at the front of the sanctuary. Mark any monetary donations that are given through the offering on the envelope or on the Memo part of the check as Outreach.

During this hard economic time, we realize many are hurting. Please only give if you are able and realize that your support through prayer, time, and kindness is just as important.

Easy 5 Ingredient Sugar Cookies

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- ½ cup powdered sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 1 cup butter softened
- Sugar for topping (optional)

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 °F (175 °C).
- 2. Mix sugar, butter and vanilla together; stir in flour.
 - 3. Chill dough for 20-30 minutes.
- 4. Form dough into balls, place on cookie sheet, and flatten to ½ inch. Alternatively, for fun shapes, flatten the dough using your the palm of your hand or rolling pin and give cookie cutters a try.
- 5. Bake 12-15 minutes until edges begin to brown.
 - 6. If desired, top with sugar. Let cool; enjoy!
