## Food Wagon

"I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the grow th. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and each will receive wages according to their own labor." 1 Corinthians 3:6-8

Way back in 2016, in the days before Food Trucks were invented, the ministry of Food Trucks was taking place. Food wagons? I was recently reminded of this just the other day, as I was taking down the tomato plants in the yard.

Many of you know, back in 2016 as Angie and I were preparing to move to our new appointment in Batesville, Indiana, I received a phone call from one of the members at BUMC, his name was Kent. Kent asked me if I liked tomatoes. I told him I did and usually put out a few plants each year. When we arrived at Batesville, next to the garage was a large patch of freshly planted tomato plants. Each year Kent returns and plants a new batch of tomatoes. The plants produce much more fruit than I can eat and some in the neighborhood began to stop and ask if they might be able to pick some tomatoes. Now, 8 years later that patch of tomatoes has grown into a neighborhood ministry, providing fresh tomatoes to many people in the community.

Last week as I was taking down the plants a car pulled up behind me and a woman began to yell, "Excuse me! Excuse me! Are those your tomatoes?"

I was expecting a complaint that I was taking down the plants and I thought to myself, why would I be tearing down someone else's plants? But I turned around and told her, "Yes."

She said, I want you to know I have been keeping an eye out, hoping to meet you. I wanted you to know just how much those tomatoes have meant to my family, especially my sister. She said her sister had lived a very difficult life and never really had much of anything, but every year as the plants were put into the ground, she got very excited. She loved tomatoes and it meant so much that somebody was so willing to be kind to her and share them.

She said, my sister passed away in 2022, but my family has continued to enjoy and appreciate those tomatoes. In fact, she said, they have inspired me to put out two plants in pots on my balcony, and when I have extra, I share them!

It all began with someone who had a passion for growing things and a willing heart to share with the new

pastor. That small gesture has now grown into a blessing for many, many people. Too often, we fail to see our small part in the greater work of God. So let us remember, one plants, one waters, but it is God who provides the growth!

The Outreach team is looking into a UMC school in Kenya that helps about 250 children get an education. Many UMC churches in Southern

Indiana have helped with this school, Green Hill Academy. The children are exceeding the requirements for education in Kenya and are learning about Jesus. They have several projects going on and we may partner with this school. Many of you shared an interest in Global Missions and this would be a part of that interest.

It is amazing to continue to see God at work through our congregation and through all of you as we continue to endeavor to reach out to our community, our nation and the world. Thank you for help, your generosity and your love for the Kingdom!
