Outreach helping near and far

In February, the administrative board voted to donate \$500 to the organization Doctors Without Borders. This organization delivers medical care to people who need it most, regardless of race, religion, gender or political affiliation.

The board also voted to donate \$500 to the Southeast Indiana Health Center. The center was founded in 2013 to help provide care to individuals who were not getting their healthcare needs met. SEIHC strives to provide quality healthcare to individuals who would not otherwise be able to receive care. The clinic is staffed primarily through volunteers to help the residents of Franklin and Ripley counties.

While these organizations are similar in helping deliver medical needs to those in need, I, and the board, thought it would be important for our church's outreach to help both worldwide and locally.

This March, we would like to donate \$1,000 to the United Methodist minister, Pastor Wonwoo Lee, who is now appointed at the Korean

United Methodist Church in Bloomington. He is currently working on his green card, which costs money. He also is married and has 4 children. His salary from the church is the minimum salary, even with his Ph.D, due to the congregation being made of mostly IU students.

In the Korean tradition, Wonwoo conducts daily prayer services at 6 a.m. and preaches three times per week.

Pastor Chris heard about this opportunity while in Columbus conducting interviews for the District Committee On Ministry for the Southeast District. No one requested anything but Pastor Chris thought this would be a very kind gesture to help a young minister starting out.

I will share every couple of months as to what the church is supporting through Outreach, both in this newsletter and at the services. I do not do this to ask for more donations from the congregation but for our board to be good stewards and let our whole church family know where our donations from our budget are going. You are al-

Lent

"If anyone thinks they are something when they are not, they deceive themselves. Each one should test their own actions."

Galatians 6:3-4a

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and



then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Lent, our favorite season? Well, probably not. Forcing ourselves to come to grips with where and who we really are is not always the most pleasant or easiest thing to do. But this season is important, and requires us to be intentional. But this heavy dose of reality should always be weighed against what we know and understand of God and God's work in us. We are all in need, of growth, of salvation, of love and even a strong dose of reality, like it or not.

It is when we truly can see ourselves as we are, not as we present ourselves or wish ourselves to be that we are ready to embrace the work of God in us. To appreciate it even more when we recognize just how little we can do, or even deserve.

I know this is heavy stuff, to understand and even do, but it is worthwhile work and it is in this work, if we can truly embrace it that we find a loving God, filled with grace and mercy, waiting on us, working in us to make us more than we could ever imagine.

So, this year, if you want to give up beer and Twinkies, great! But the truly important work is about surrendering our own facade and being brutally honest with ourselves and the God who is at work in us!
