Outreach helpings Texas flood victims

This month the administrative board voted to donate \$500 to United Methodist Committee on Relief to help with the catastrophic flooding in Texas.

The following paragraph is from the UMCOR website.

On July 4, 2025, historic rain levels led to catastrophic flash flooding along the Guadalupe River in Central Texas. As of July 9, at least 110 people have died,



including 27 campers and counselors from Camp Mystic, an all-girls summer camp in Hunt, Texas. In response, UMCOR has awarded a solidarity grant to the Rio Texas Annual Conference to support their relief efforts. This grant will provide immediate relief to those impacted through Early Response Team deployment, debris removal, distribution of relief supplies and more. Continue to pray for those who have lost loved ones and for all who have been impacted by this devastating disaster.

If you would also like to personally make a donation to the TX flood relief you can bring a check to church and put it in the offering (Mark your check to UMCOR) or put it in the Outreach mailbox until the end of July.



Information about donations and helping to make them and sell them will be coming out later in August. Hope you will join in the fun and support this huge undertaking.


