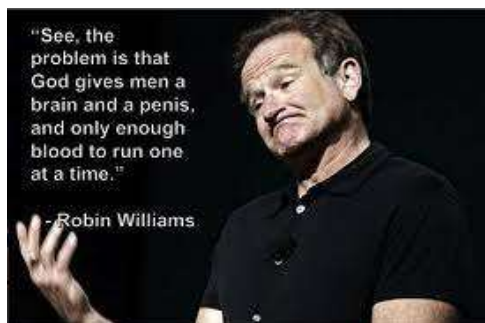
What makes you think that's fair?
