

### Bukchon Hanok Village

You can't visit Korea without exploring Bukchon Hanok Village, a picturesque area filled with traditional Korean houses (hanoks). Wander through the narrow alleys and experience the charm of historical Seoul.

Bukchon Hanok Village will capture your heart. It's one of the few places in Seoul that still preserves Korea's traditional past. Dating back over 600 years to the Joseon Dynasty (1392-1910), Bukchon Hanok Village was once home to royals, aristocrats, wealthy families, and government officials who lived in the beautifully crafted hanok houses here. The defining characteristic of Bukchon is its hanoks—traditional Korean houses built from natural materials like Korean red pine, earth, and stone.

"Bukchon" means "northern village" in Korean, as it lies north of central Seoul, above Cheonggyecheon Stream. Tucked between the iconic Gyeongbokgung and Changdeokgung Palaces, Bukchon Hanok Village almost faced redevelopment in the 1960s, but local residents protested and managed to protect the area from modernization. Thanks to their efforts, the legacy of the Joseon Dynasty endures in this historic enclave.





#### Cultural Sites of Seoul

Gyeongbokgung Palace is one of the most iconic and grandest palaces in South Korea, located in the heart of Seoul. Built in 1395 during the Joseon Dynasty, it served as the main royal palace and is a symbol of Korean history and culture.

Located in front of Gyeongbokgung Palace, Gwanghwamun Plaza is an open public square that serves as a symbol of Korea's long history. It is home to two iconic statues: King Sejong the Great, the creator of Hangul (Korean alphabet), and Admiral Yi Sun-sin, a famous naval commander.

As a historical site, Sungnyemun Gate is often featured in various K-dramas, music videos, and promotional materials. Its cultural importance makes it a recognizable backdrop for many artists, including K-pop groups








### Star Avenue at Lotte Department Store

Star Avenue at Lotte Department Store is a popular destination for K-pop fans. Located in the bustling Myeongdong area of Seoul, Star Avenue offers a unique experience where fans can immerse themselves in K-pop culture and see various exhibits dedicated to their favorite artists.

Star Avenue is a must-visit for K-pop enthusiasts and anyone looking to experience the vibrant K-pop culture in Seoul.



### HIKR Ground

HiKR (hi Korea) Ground at the Korea Tourism Organization (KTO) Seoul Center is an exciting venue for K-pop fans. It serves as a promotional space for various Korean cultural experiences.

#### Highlights of HiRK Ground:

- •K-pop Exhibits: HiKR Ground often features exhibitions related to K-pop, including displays of albums, costumes, and other memorabilia from popular music groups.
- •Interactive Experiences: The venue may offer interactive activities, such as dance challenges or virtual reality experiences related to K-pop, allowing fans to engage more deeply with the culture.

#### **VISIT ICONIC MUSIC VIDEO LOCATIONS**



Hyango Beach Bus Terminal, also dubbed "Bangtan Bus Stop," is where the album cover for BTS' "You Never Walk Alone" and the music video of "Spring Day" were shot. We will have plenty of time for Instagram worthy photos as well as spending a little time in the sun.

Then we will be moving on to Maengbang Beach in Samcheok-si, Gangwon-do, the location where BTS had their photo shoot for their album Butter. When you first enter the beach, you immediately see the famous brightly colored chairs and umbrellas reproduced from the BTS shoot. Next to the chairs is a volleyball net and balls where you can play with friends and create your own memories.

The Mosun Aerodrome in Jecheon, North Chungcheong Province, South Korea, has become a tourist hotspot thanks to its use in BTS's "EPILOGUE: Young Forever" music video. Interest in visiting the site increased alongside the group's worldwide popularity. The defense-owned airport was constructed in 1950 as a training ground for preventing war and establishing a peace regime and is now mostly used as a public park. Coffee shops and restaurants have cropped up near the empty runway in Goam-dong as more tourists flock to the area, adding to the tourist attraction.

Jamsil Olympic Stadium in Seoul, South Korea, is a historic multi-purpose stadium that was originally built for the 1988 Summer Olympics. It remains one of South Korea's largest stadiums, with a capacity of around 69,000 spectators. Located in the Jamsil Sports Complex, it has hosted major international sports events, including FIFA and athletics competitions.

In recent years, it has become a popular venue for K-pop concerts, attracting global superstars like BTS, Blackpink, and EXO. The stadium is known for its breathtaking night skyline views, especially when concerts light up the arena.





K-Star Road is a popular destination in Seoul, specifically located in the trendy district of Gangnam. It's known for its connection to K-pop and is a must-visit spot for fans of the genre.

The K-Star Road has the most luxurious brands in the world, like Louis Vitton, Channel, Gucci, Cartier and more. And aside from the luxury brands, many of the entertainment agencies are located here, that's why this is known as the road where stars are born. BT21 Line Friends store, cafes and shops also line the street for fans to enjoy.

Sungnyemun Gate (also known as Namdaemun Gate) is one of Korea's National Treasures and a historic landmark in Seoul. Built in 1398 during the Joseon Dynasty, it served as the main southern gate to the walled city of Seoul.

The gate features traditional Korean wooden architecture atop a massive stone base and is one of the oldest surviving wooden structures in the country. Located near Namdaemun Market, it's a great stop for history lovers exploring Seoul!









The Jamsil Sports Complex is a massive multi-purpose sports facility built for the 1986 Asian Games and the 1988 Summer Olympics. Located in the Jamsil district, it includes several major venues, such as:

Jamsil Olympic Stadium — The largest stadium in Korea, used for concerts, soccer, and athletics, Jamsil Baseball Stadium, Jamsil Indoor Gymnasium, & the Jamsil Swimming Pool — Used for major swimming competitions.

The complex is a popular sports and entertainment hub, often hosting K-pop concerts, marathons, and cultural festivals.

### Optional Excursions During Free Time



Lotte World Adventure is a major recreation complex in Seoul, South Korea. It consists of a large indoor theme park an outdoor amusement park called "Magic Island", an artificial island on a lake linked by monorail, shopping malls, a luxury hotel, an observation tower, a Korean folk museum, sports facilities, and movie theaters.

#### Bukhansan National Park Hike

Follow your guide on an easy hike in Bukhansan National Park. Along the way, visit a Buddhist temple and learn about the mountain's long history. After a filling lunch at a local restaurant, unwind at a traditional Korean spa.





Visit N Seoul Tower (Namsan Tower) for breathtaking night skyline views.

Explore Myeongdong, Seoul's street food capital (try tteokbokki, hotteok, and grilled lobster).

End with a peaceful walk along Cheonggyecheon Stream, an urban oasis in the city.
