M I N U T E S Mason Consolidated Schools Meeting of the Board of Education

On May 17, 2021, the Mason Consolidated Schools Board of Education held a regular meeting. President Stieben called the meeting to order at 6:09 p.m.

New Business

The next regular scheduled Board of Education meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 2, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. in the Library at Mason High School.

Resolution - Monroe County ISD 2021-2022 Budget

-The MCISD provided a video presentation reviewing their budget for 2021-2022 to administration and the Board of Education. Each year each local is to take formal action to approve or not to approve the ISD budget. Last year our Board of Education did not approve the budget requesting Mason administration be included and participate in the review of potential modification of the Monroe County Special Education Plan, specific documentation used by MCISD for reimbursements, a request regarding ACT 18 Special Education Millage Fund disbursement, and a discussion and review of how students are selected for the Monroe County Middle College. The ISD met with the administration sharing their services along with how they are funded at an initial orientation and why their fund balance is at the current levels, but no other meetings took place to address the concerns from the previous year.

-Mr. Stieben reported that he watched the video several times and still feels that the ISD is not understanding what the District is asking for and is holding too much money given to them by the state that should be going back to the schools as cash or equivalent services. We need to provide suggestions to fix things and a letter has been drafted in the event the budget is not approved again. Mr. Bates shared that the HS used to have four special education teachers

and now has two. Superintendent Tuller discussed the desire to have more co-teaching and that we need to detail the need for staffing. Mrs. Larrow discussed her hesitancy to sign the agreement because it states the district was involved with the planning of the ISD Special Education Plan, but that is not true. It was agreed that communication from the ISD and involvement of the local superintendents needs to improve.

Recommendation for Hire- Head Cook

- Recommendation from Food Service Director, Kadie Petrovic, to hire Rachel Leichy for the head cook postion at \$13.41 per hour. Ms. Petrovic highlighted Ms. Leichy's experinence and great attitude as attributes to add to the current team.

Consideration of Resolution for 2021 MCISD Board of Elections

-Mr. Stieben presented there are two candidates running for the two open seats on the ISD Board. Incumbents Renee Larzelere and Dr. Barry Martin are running unopposed for six-year terms. The Board of Education is to adopt the resolution at the Mason Board of Education Meeting on June 2, 2021 to allow Mrs. Skaggs to vote for these two candidates at the June 7, 2021 ISD Board Election meeting.

Recommendation for approval for project upgrades at the middle school softball field

-Operations Director, Michael Valentine, asked for approval on behalf of Ms. Deana Vanderpool complete electrical work to erect a batting cage at the middle school softball diamond. All work and equipment will be at no cost to the district, with the exception of the minimal cost of electricity during the seasonal months the batting cage is in use.

Recommendation for approval to grant exception to commencement guidelines

-Mr. Bates presented a request to grant an exception to the commencement participation requirements for a student who is working on a dual completion of both his high school diploma and associate degree from Monroe County Community College. It is recommended that the student be permitted to participate in the 2022 Commencement Ceremony, but not receive his high school diploma until all courses are complete for the welding program at MCCC during the summer of 2022.

Discussion- Middle School Softball/Baseball

-Athletic Director, Kelly Trainor, shared the current status of middle school softball and baseball and considerations necessary if these sports become district sponsored. Middle School softball has never been a school funded sport and middle school baseball has not been a school funded sport since 1999.

Public Comment

- Tom and Rose Sancrant from the local VFW gave information relating to the yearly Patriot Pen contest. They would like to get information into the students' hands early this year so they can think about it over the summer. They would also like to post in the hallways for students to see. It was also requested that information about the Patriot Pen contest be posted on our Middle School and High School Facebook pages to get visibility to students that may not be attending in our buildings. This year's winners will be recognized at the Memorial Day ceremony. Commander Sancrant also mentioned that our teachers that get nominated for Teacher of the Year are ranked highly with others in Southeast Michigan.
- -Chris McClain reviewed the dates of discussions and decisions related to Middle School Softball and deeming it a club sport and not a school sponsored sport. She reviewed rules created and what the school would and would not assist with.
- -Deana Vanderpool stated that Chris kept all of her notes for all of these years.
- -Brian Regnier shared how his daughter has grown socially and academically through competing in the Middle School softball team. He stated that making softball a school sport will help prepare students with what it is like to compete in sports while in school. He wanted to thank everyone for doing what they are doing to support the softball program. It is possible that no other schools may

not have made this a school sponsored sport because nobody else has done it yet and someone has to be the first to make the change.

-Crystal Regnier asked to change the Middle School softball program from a club sport to a school sponsored sport. She stated that Coach Vanderpool and Coach McClain have changed the lives of girls as well as their families. She listed softball skills, teamwork, leadership, and time management skills along with many others that these coaches have taught their team. She listed many benefits related to students participating in school sports. She expressed gratitude to the difference the sport has made in her daughter's life.

Superintendent's Report

<u>Resignations</u>: Accepted the following resignations: Juanita Alt, Central Elementary School aide for the past 2 years. Juanita shared her gratitude for all of the help and patience she received, allowing her to become the best assistant teacher she could be. Jeanne Geddes, thirty-one-year veteran of MCS, shared that the most enjoyable part of the job has been the students and staff. Anita Lindsey, MCS twenty-year veteran retires at the end of this school year and states that the students, the parents, and the staff have given her great pleasure over the years her. All three ladies will be greatly missed, and we honor them for their commitment to the students of Mason

<u>Vacancy</u>: A posting for a Middle School Science/STEM teacher was posted on May 11, 2021. The interview committee hopes to have a recommendation for hire at the June 2, 2021 meeting. <u>COVID-19 Update</u>: Monroe County Superintendents have been working tirelessly with the Monroe County Health Department, legal counsel, and the district insurance carrier to evaluate the possibility of a revision to close contact quarantine and mask requirements. At this time, the Monroe County Health Department recommends a 10-day quarantine for close contacts of positive COVID-19 individuals and to follow the CDC recommendation of schools following all previously established protocols for the remainder of the year, including masking. <u>Robotics:</u> The end of year "learnings" has been submitted to the State. This has been a great year for our kiddos to experience an introduction to science and engineering through programming, collaboration, and the rebuild and build of the robot and performance of the robot. We are proud of our team and coaches Jason Burt, Erin Ziems, and volunteer Mark Monarch. We will be expanding on this program in the future.

Roofing Update: The District must bid the previously approved work for the music room and courtyard. The RFP has since been placed on the State website, newspaper and on our website. A process has been outlined to ensure steps are followed in regard to future projects.

Assessment/Evaluations: The District summative assessment window closes June 4. All administrator and teacher evaluations have a component utilizing this information. Final evaluations can be completed after this date. On June 2, President Stieben will discuss the steps for completing the superintendent evaluation.
