# **Operations**

Pool update: Copper wire has been installed. The inspector will be in on Thursday to review the work before it is covered up. The handicap lift is delayed in shipping. ADA does not allow us to have a portable lift, so we had to go with a permanently placed one.

The floor in room 16 at the middle school was removed and it was found that there is a significant settling issue that has caused the floor to crack and slope and cause gaps along the register units. This is being addressed.

One high school boiler did not pass inspection because of a leaking tube. This will have to be addressed. The other boiler was addressed in the summer of 2020.

Lockout USA was out July 28<sup>th</sup> to obtain measurements for our safety commitments with them including the boot, ballistic shields, placards, and critical incident and room mappings.

## Monroe County School of Choice Enrollment

We will have an addition of 10 new students approved to enroll including an exchange student from Vietnam. 4 current students have been released to attend other Monroe County districts.
