School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for Mason Senior High School. For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Our team of stakeholders has identified priorities of focus for the upcoming year, this includes: continuing to implement our Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS process) to progress monitor student achievement and support students who are showing deficiencies in their learning as a result of the pandemic. Instructional practices will include relevant Tier II intervention strategies, common vocabulary outlined in our curriculum model and embedded SAT strategies throughout daily instruction.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students who attend Mason Senior High School come directly from our Middle School building, via transfer, or are accepted as a School of Choice student from neighboring districts.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The School Improvement Plan continues to be modified to meet the curricular and achievement demands for our district. Based on our student achievement data, the need to align our curriculum has become our district's biggest priority. We will continue to work with a curriculum consultant from the MDE to help finish the alignment and initial roll out of our curriculum model. In this model, our focus will be on developing "I Can statements," "Content Vocabulary," "Scope and Sequence," "Assessments," "Instructional Lessons" and "Resources" for all core area classes. Also, we will continue to redefine our MTSS model to meet the at risk demands of our students. This includes our restorative justice practices and mental health support.

3. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION, AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL.

Implementation of the Mason Senior High School core curriculum varies as the State and Federal requirements change, student performance data is reviewed, and student needs evolve. Continual evaluation of these expectations is the guiding factor in revisions to the delivery and assessment of core content. All curricula meet requirements of the Michigan Merit Curriculum, content expectations, and Common Core State Standards (CCSS). 4. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR ANY LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

In the Fall of 2020, Mason Senior High School administered the SAT test to the Senior class of 2021. This test was not given in the Spring of 2020 and the next SAT test is scheduled again in the Spring of 2021. Composite, ELA, and Math assessment results are listed.
